Before we get into the Round 4 action today, I'll take a moment to congratulate everyone that helped make our standalone ANZAC Day blockbuster at the QEO happen including the South Bendigo FNC, Eaglehawk FNC, Sandhurst FNC and the City of Greater Bendigo and the Bendigo RSL.

Perfect weather conditions and a great matchup across the board resulted in a huge crowd and enabled us to showcase high-quality BFNL football and netball.

It also highlighted the importance of one of Australia's most meaningful days.

Pat Cronin Foundation Round



This week, the BFNL again partners with the Pat Cronin Foundation (PCF) to educate and empower young Australians to handle conflict, look after their mates, and make wise decisions - so we can End the Coward Punch, together.

The Pat Cronin Foundation Round, this year from May 1-3, continues to grow as one of the most significant initiatives in community sport with nine football and netball leagues, 289 clubs, 3,263 teams, 77,500 players and over 300,000 supporters all united by one powerful purpose

We all know that sport can bring out big emotions - the highs, the lows, and the heat of the moment - but teaching young players how to manage

those emotions is just as important as teaching them the game itself.

The Round is about reinforcing the life lessons young athletes learn both on and off the field, especially around managing anger, conflict, and making wise decisions. The involvement of leagues, such as the BFNL, helps ensure those messages are being delivered at an age when they matter most.

PCF Yellow Armbands - During the Round, every player will wear a yellow armband - the official colour of the Foundation - to symbolise a stand against all forms of violence, including the Coward Punch.

The armband is also a conversation starter, raising awareness of the impact of senseless violence. Additionally, all players will be encouraged to shake hands before and after each game during the round, as a mark of respect for their opponents

Why the Foundation was established - The Pat Cronin Foundation was created in honour of Pat Cronin, a promising young footballer who died in 2016 after he was struck by a Coward Punch.

Pat's story is a powerful reminder of the devastating impact violence can have—not only on individuals, but on families, friends, and entire communities.

The Foundation provides violence-prevention education in schools, sports clubs and other organisations across the country each year, with a goal to directly reach one million young Australians by the end of 2027.

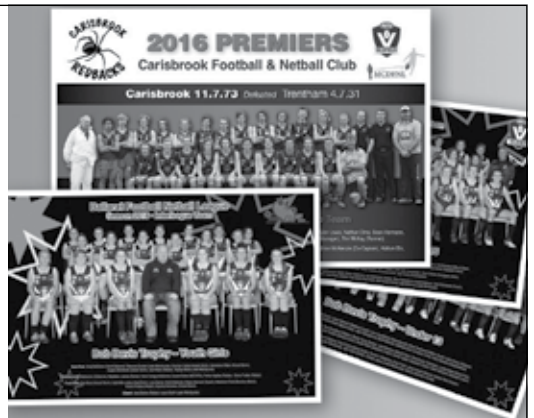

Round Preview



A lengthy winless run for Kangaroo Flat or Broadford will be broken in this Saturday's match to complete the split fourth round in the Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy season.

The showdown of two kangaroo mobs at Dower Park is feature match in the Pat Cronin Foundation Round.

Nine leagues across Victoria have united in the drive to End the Coward Punch.

Support from 289 clubs, more than 3200 teams, 77,000 players, and 300,000-plus fans will have a significant impact on the Pat Cronin Foundation's message.

On the footy field Kangaroo Flat and Broadford are vying for their first win in many weeks.

Kangaroo Flat has not claimed premiership points since a 126-48 victory against Maryborough on June 29, 2024 at Dower Park.

Broadford returned from a two-year recess on the footy front to join the Bendigo FNL after it had competed in division two of the Outer East FNL.

The Broadford players and fans have not sung the senior after a senior match since a 44-point win against Yarra Junction on July 1, 2023 at Broadford's Harley Hammond Reserve.

A spirited showing against Eaglehawk in round three was Kangaroo Flat's best performance in many matches.

The Tyrone Downie-coached Roos will be aiming to raise the level of intensity they brought against the Hawks to take the points.

Key players for Kangaroo Flat include ruckman Angus Macpherson, Nick Lang, Mitch Collins, Nick Keogh, Max Johnson and Mitch Rovers.

A tough run for Broadford began with South Bendigo at home and was followed by playing Sandhurst on the QEO.

The Kangaroos worked hard to score six goals at home against Golden Square last round.

Players to watch for Broadford include Jaiden Magor, Louis Thompson, Seb Morris, Rhys Carman, captain Adam Miles, and CJ Brill.

Two of the league's greatest rivals, Sandhurst and Golden Square face-off at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

It's been a lengthy break for Sandhurst which had the bye after the win against Broadford.

There's plenty of running power and attacking options in Sandhurst's line-up.

Players to watch in a team coached by Bryce Curnow, non-playing, and Fergus Greene, playing, include Nick Stagg, Oliver Morris, Tom Campbell, Cobi Maxted and Caleb Connick.

A one-two record has Golden Square in sixth place.

Pressure will be the name of the game for the Brad Eaton and Liam Barrett-coached Bulldogs.

The form of Terry Reeves, Jordan Rosengren, co-captains Jayden Burke and Jack Stewart, Tom Strauch and Isaac Corvo will be crucial to Square's chances of an upset victory.

Strathfieldsaye and Castlemaine meet in a crucial contest in Storm territory at Triple M Park.

The Jeff Andrews-coached Storm is seventh, but has played just two matches.

Strathfieldsaye won the Good Friday match against South Bendigo by seven points, had a bye, and was then beaten at Gisborne's Gardiner Reserve by 35 points.

Key players for Storm include Tyson McKenzie, Jaidi Jackson-Leahy, Zach Charles, James Schischka, Hunter Lawrence and Lachlan Ratcliffe.

Castlemaine will be determined to rebound from a six-goal loss to South Bendigo.

The Bailey Henderson-coached Magpies were outgunned in the first quarter as the Bloods led 43-8 at the break.

The Magpies will look for big games from Michael Hartley, Callum McConachy, Harrison Sheahan, Zavier Murley, Archie Rixon and Rhys Jenkins.

Round four kicked off with a superb contest between South Bendigo and Eaglehawk on Anzac Day under the QEO lights.

Scores were locked on 57-all going into the final quarter.

Accuracy in attack became a key factor as South Bendigo went on to win 14.8 (92) to 10.15 (75).

Best for the Bloods were Brody Haddow, Hayden Geddes, Coen Harker and Tom Templeton.

Eaglehawk's best were Michelsen medallists Noah Wheeler and Billy Evans, Jonty Neaves and Ben Thompson.

Gisborne has the bye.

On the netball court it's third against fourth as Sandhurst plays Golden Square.

The Tamara Gilchrist-coached Sandhurst has won both its matches.

Golden Square is fourth in the premiership race on a two-one record.

The Teigan Redwood-coached team won its latest hit-out in Broadford by 37 goals.

Strathfieldsaye and Castlemaine will be determined to bank their first points of the season.

Storm played well in a 42-44 loss to South Bendigo on Good Friday and then played at Gisborne in the third round.

Huge challenge for Broadford against reigning premier Kangaroo Flat on its court.

Gisborne has a rest leading into next Saturday's match at Castlemaine.

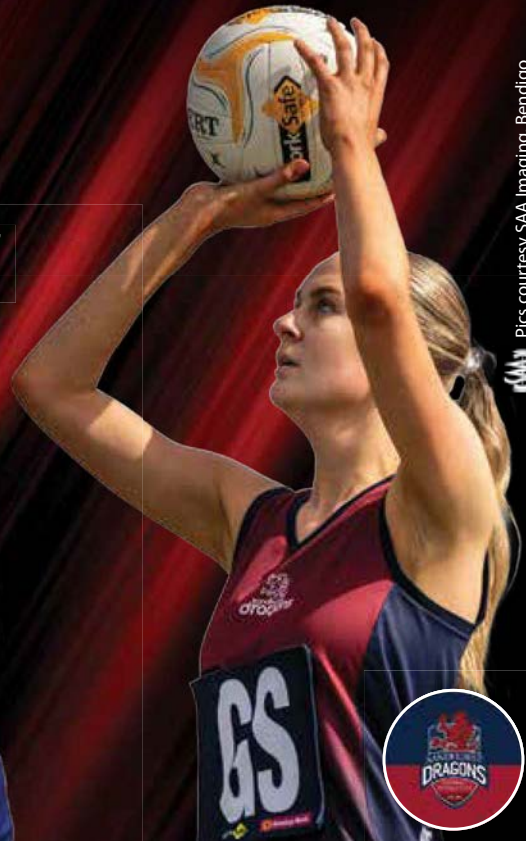

Reflections...

Sandhurst beats North Bendigo: July 1892

There's fans and supporters of Bendigo footy in all corners of Australia, but just recently I've been contacted by a rabid historian based in the United Kingdom.

He's John Weiland and he's done a massive amount of research into past family members who played Bendigo footy in the late 1800s.

Now he's aware that in the old days of typewriters and hot metal newspaper preparation, spelling of names sometimes wasn't always terribly accurate.

So John has researched old Addies and even the old Bendigo Independent newspaper and found reports in newspaper match summaries of how players spelled "Weiland" and "Wieland" performed in their matches.

Consequently here's most of the match report published in the Addy on 28th July 1892 of the clash between Sandhurst and North Bendigo, played at the Back Creek oval ---- now South Bendigo's home ground in Neale Street, Kennington.

"The third match between these clubs in the current season took place at the Back Creek Cricket Ground in the presence of a fair number of spectators," the report begins.

"The game started at four o'clock with Sandhurst winning the toss and kicking towards the pavilion end goal. Sandhurst's Roeder returned the ball from the forward arc and the sphere (19th century name for the football) was gradually worked further downfield.

"Curry picked it up, but although he had a clear run to goal he mulled, and the ball went out of bounds on the opposite wing. Thrown in a scrimmage ensued in front of the posts but McTavish put his to it and the ball sped to the centre.

"After another scrimmage in front of the North Bendigo posts Johnson secured in a nice position

for North Bendigo, but kicked out of bounds near the behind post.

"On the ball being thrown in, Sandhurst's Thomas received a free kick and had no difficulty in raising the two flags. North Bendigo rallied and for a few minutes besieged their opponent's goals but nothing came of it.

"Potter marked and foolishly attempted a run with the result that he lost the ball and McTavish of North again toed the ball in the nick of time.

"Trehwella sent to Weiland and a long kick sent the ball towards the North goal but that was repulsed and then McTavish sent to Mundy who posted North's first behind.

"Play continued on the pavilion wing and Doody had another shot but failed to score."

"Quarter time arrived with the score: Sandhurst 1 goal, North Bendigo 1 behind.

There's no mention of how long each quarter was but with a match starting at 4 pm on a July winter weekend one can only assume

they didn't run much past 15 minutes. I'll have to do some further research and check that out.

And as far as I know there was no time-on except when the footy was kicked into the crowd and the timekeepers stopped their clocks, waiting for the one central umpire to signal play was about to start again.

So on with the match report. "Mundy of North Bendigo shied at the sticks, but missed, then Male put in some good work and the sphere was returned. Sinclair carried it away with the ball eventually going out of bounds near the pavilion.

"Johnson had another chance for Sandhurst, then Magee and Thomas returned but North's Mundy relieved after he received a free kick.

"Back again, and Johnson had another chance this

time succeeding in registering Sandhurst's second goal.

"Alf Nosworthy added a behind to the score while another was kicked out of a scrum and shortly after by another."

Half-time: Sandhurst 2 goals 3 behinds; North Bendigo 1 behind.

"North Bendigo at once began an attack when play resumed. Mundy shied, but missed, and Sinclair and Roeder centred.

"W. Curry chipped in, but Weiland spoiled his play while Hill and Luke were conspicuous in defence. North Bendigo continued to attack and after the kick-off following a behind Butler of North marked and atoned for his previous failures by kicking a splendid goal.

"At the change of ends for the last time the tallies were: Sandhurst 2 goals 4 behinds; North Bendigo 1 goal 2 behinds."

The reporter seems to have run out of puff because he wrapped up the last quarter in just two sentences.

"The last quarter was excessively rough and the ball travelled up and down the ground rapidly.

"Heine scored the third goal for Sandhurst from a free kick a few yards in front and the game ended with Sandhurst the victors."

Final scores: Sandhurst 3 goals 4 behinds. North Bendigo 1 goal 2 behinds.

Best players, Sandhurst: Thomas, Luke, Magee, A. Nosworthy, W. Curry and E. Curry. North Bendigo: McTavish, Mundy, Trewhella, Dore, Lewis, Male and Weiland.

"Mr. D. Kerr, who acted as umpire, allowed a great deal of valuable time to be wasted by players wilfully kicking the ball out of bounds," the report concluded. So there, you are. Umpire criticism --- in print --- dating back more than 130 years. And remembering that there was a North Bendigo in the then Bendigo Football Association until the mid-1890s.

Our footy body became the Bendigo Football League in 1913 --- previously the Bendigo Football Association --- and the 1890s North Bendigo has very little association (if any) with the current HDFNL Bulldogs.

It was a competing club in Bendigo footy from 1888--1897. North Sandhurst, gone for 132 seasons, competed from 1887 to 1893. And our power club Sandhurst, one of the three foundation BFA clubs in 1880 along with Eaglehawk and Bendigo, went into recess from 1901--1919.

Yep, the mighty Maroons --- now the Dragons --- weren't seen on Bendigo's footy ovals for 18 seasons.

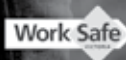

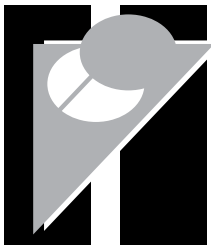
