Round Preview



There's plenty at stake as Eaglehawk takes on Strathfieldsaye in round five of the Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy season.

It's fifth against fourth on the Borough's turf at C & M Oval in Canterbury Park.

Both teams have achieved two wins, but it's Storm which has a game in hand.

The Borough will be determined to capitalise on home-ground advantage in such a crucial match.

Despite a lengthy injury list the Hawks showed plenty of fight to be within 17 points of South Bendigo at the end of a top contest on Anzac Day under the lights at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

Strathfieldsaye Storm charged to a 55-point win against Castlemaine in the Pat Cronin Foundation Round match at Triple M Park.

Midfield and on-ball battles will be a highlight of the Hawks and Storm showdown.

Key players for the Borough include Michelsen medallists Billy Evans and Noah Wheeler, along with Ben Thompson, ruckman Callum Heath, Ben Thompson, Joel Mullen, and wingman Oscar White.

The Hawks' best against South Bendigo included Jonty Neaves and James Coates-moore.

A Storm attack led by James Schishka, Zach Charles and Pat Blake will test the Hawks.

Tyson McKenzie, Daniel Clohesy, Riley Wilson and Jaidi Jackson-Leahy are capable of setting up a lot of the play for the Jeff Andrews-coached Storm.

Stung by a nine-goal defeat on Strathfieldsaye's turf, Castlemaine returns to The Railway Hotel in Camp Reserve to tackle Gisborne.

Another huge challenge for the Bailey Henderson-coached which started with wins against Golden

Square and Kangaroo Flat, but was outpointed by South Bendigo and Strathfieldsaye.

Key players for the Magpies include Michael Hartley, Kalan Huntly, Xavier Murley, Callum McConachy, Darby Semmens and Hunter Staples.

The Rob Waters-coached Gisborne had the bye after a hard-fought 35-point victory against Storm in round three.

A Bulldogs' attack that includes Harry Luxmoore, Pat McKenna and Zac Denahy will aim to capitalise on chances set up by the likes of Brad Bernacki, Thomas Werner, Braidon Blake, Matt Merrett and Adam Brancatisano.

Sandhurst is back at Queen Elizabeth Oval to take on Kangaroo Flat.

The Dragons fielded one of their most experienced teams in many seasons against Golden Square but was able to take the points.

Players to watch for a Sandhurst team jointly coached by Bryce Curnow, non-playing, and Fergus Greene, playing, include Lachie Hood, Jack Keating, Matt Wilkinson and Lachlan Wright.

The Dragons have Tom Campbell and Cobi Macted as strong targets in the forward 50m arc.

Kangaroo Flat teamed superbly for a long-awaited breakthrough victory last round.

The Tyrone Downie-coached Kangaroos will now work on building on the confidence and momentum.

A key factor for Flat will be its pressure in all parts of the ground against a hard-running and skilful opponents.

Players to watch for the Kangaroos include Nick Keogh in attack, Tyran Farmer in defence, ruckman Angus Macpherson, Aaron Nevins and Mitch Rovers.

The Kangaroos also have the experience of Mitch Collins, Nick Lang and Jeremy Rodi.

Golden Square has the bye.

It's also a rest for Broadford and South Bendigo who met in the stand-alone season launch match on March 28 at Broadford's Harley Hammond Reserve.

The Bloods won by 205 points.

On the netball court it's a rematch of '25 grand finalists Sandhurst and Kangaroo Flat at Queen Elizabeth Oval.



When these clubs met last September it was Kangaroo Flat which claimed premiership glory.

The Jayden Cowling-coached Kangaroos have made a great start in their quest for back-to-back titles.

A 42-39 win for the Kangaroos at Gisborne on Good Friday was followed by a 79-goal victory against Castlemaine, a 34-goal win at Eaglehawk.

Pressure on the Kangaroos from the Dragons will be high in all thirds of the court.

Both line-ups have plenty of attacking power, but also work incredibly hard to disrupt or intercept passes.

Eaglehawk takes on a Strathfieldsaye line-up which scored a 36-goal win last round.

It was a breakthrough victory for the Jess Mangan-coached Storm which starts the day a rung above the Janelle Hobbs-coached Eaglehawk.

Huge task for the Vanessa Saunders-coached Castlemaine on its court at Camp Reserve against Gisborne.

The Tarryn Rymer-coached Gisborne rolls into the game on a two-one record and determined to stay in touch with the top three.

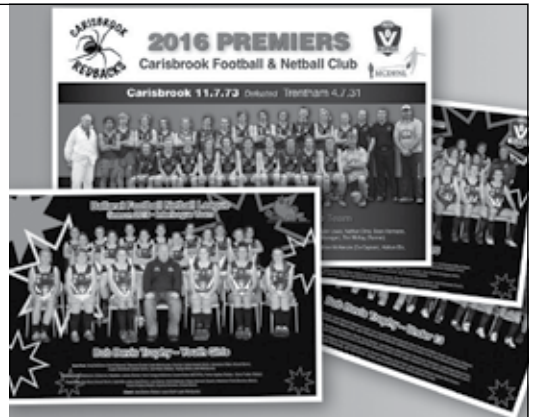

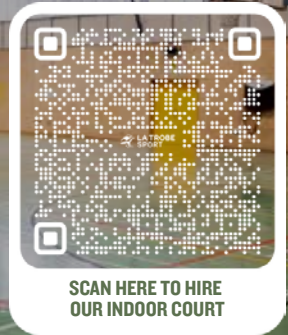

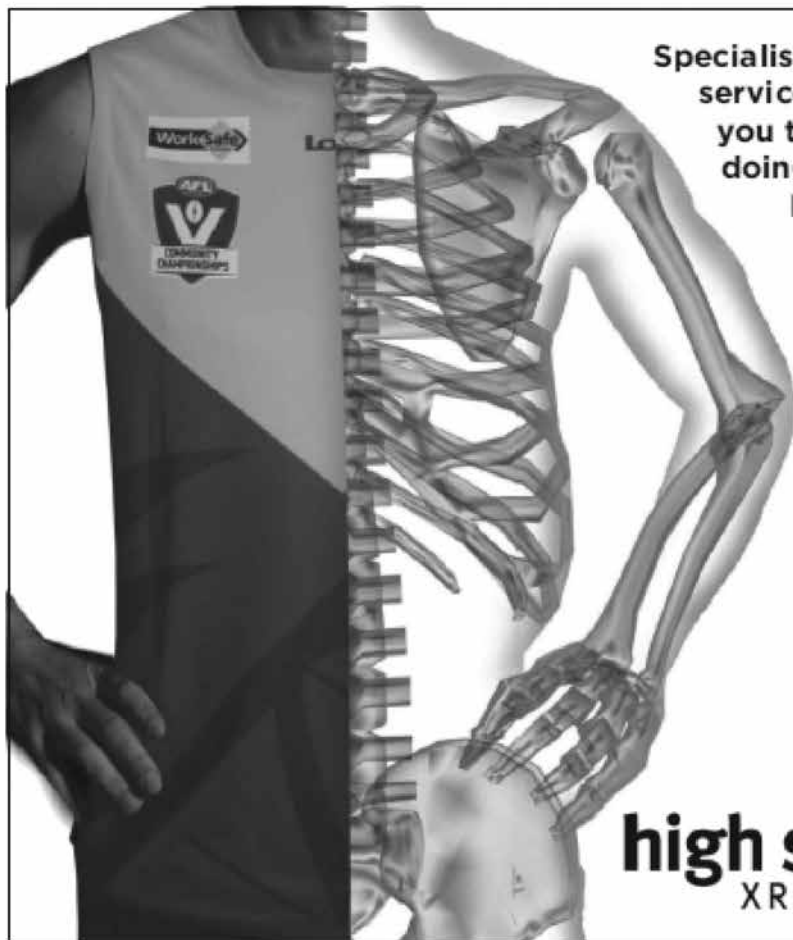

Maine improves in late 1980s

Castlemaine rocketed back up the BFL ladder in the late Eighties after two seasons down in, or close to, the cellar.

It was in 1987 and '88 that incoming coach Kerin Lourey took the Camp Reserve Pies to the preliminary finals in both seasons with a group of talented new young players leading the drive.

Exciting young key forward Steven Oliver and on-ballers Rod Keogh and Derrick Filo gave the Magpies a whole new look in 1988, but let's look back to 1987 first.

After a 2 wins-16 loss 1985 season, Castlemaine improved a tiny bit in 1986 with a 3 win-15 defeats year, but then Lourey tightened up their defence and had a firing forward line.

John Jefferies played his 150th game against Kyneton and then key defender Ron Cwthn celebrated his 250th as the Maine thrashed North Bendigo on the Atkins Street ground.

But Dale Willams' 150th wasn't enough to drag the Maine home at Eaglehawk's Canterbury Park before Lenny Watson ran out onto the QEO for his 100th. He'd endured a long run of serious injuries.

Lourey had his side firing as the finals approached. For only the third time in 20 years the Magpies downed Golden Square, led by Jefferies who nailed 10 goals at full-forward before the Kyneton home game loomed.

It was a huge day at the Camp Reserve with a big reunion underway so Lourey's side downed Kyneton and followed up by a must-win over South Bendigo to ensure a finals spot for 1987.

Their great early August home-and-away form continued as they rolled the Bloods for the second time in as many weeks in the 1987 elimination final.

A second finals win, again with Kyneton the beaten club, propelled the Maine into the preliminary final but they couldn't get past Eaglehawk.

Still, it had been a vastly improved season and Lourey and his associates were confident 1988 would be another beauty.

Especially considering Steven Oliver and Rod Keogh were on the senior list. Ollie gave rival club defenders a preview of what was to come when he drilled nine goals from 13 shots in Rd.3 against Square while Derrick Filo dominated the match, finishing with 34 touches.

Injuries struck mid-season when Keogh, Ollie, Mick Rolfe and Vidovic were late withdrawals for the return Golden Square match and the Bulldogs made sure of victory with a first term of 8.5.

By Rd. 14 with all the big guns back Castlemaine unwound a devastating burst against Eaglehawk. Filo amassed a set of statistics I've never, ever seen --- before or since.

By halftime he'd got 25 kicks, eight handballs and 11 marks beside his name on the stats' man's list but have a look at his final tallies.

Filo ended the day with 54 disposals and 17 marks for the day. Yep, more than half-a-century in stats something I've never ever seen --- before or since.

It was Jefferies' turn in the Kangaroo Flat re-match as he drilled 10 majors. Castlemaine booted 14.2 in a devastating first quarter, and then an even better 16.5 in the third.

The Magpies ended the match on a staggering total of 40.15 (255). Just before the finals another huge total -- 38.19 (247) -- was on the Castlemaine score sheet, but their form slipped in the qualifying final as Northern United completely outplayed them.

Form returned for the first semi and the Magpies downed Kyneton but the win came at a cost.

Before the first bounce tough enforcer Dale Williams was involved in a melee and reported. The Maine went on to defeat Kyneton, but Williams was suspended mid-week while prolific on-baller Phil Seaton sat out the semi with a hammie.

Castlemaine squandered their wind advantage in the prelim. final booting 3.7 in the first term allowing United to stay within reach and the Swallows went on to win by 16 points.

Nevertheless, the Magpies were near the top of the ladder and with Oliver on his way to a stellar career, becoming only the second BFNL forward other than Ron Best to kick a career total of more than 1,000 goals, the future looked rosy for the Maine.

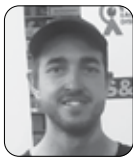

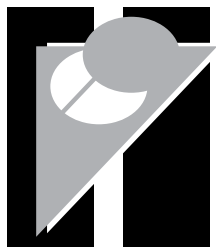
