## Graeme Wright Memorial

South Bendigo today host Sandhurst in the annual Graeme Wright Memorial match at Harry Trott Oval, a matchup in the fixture which has great importance for both clubs and has a growing history and rivalry between the previous QEO co-tenants.

South Bendigo & Sandhurst continue to honour Wright's memory by hosting the annual memorial match, coinciding with the home game against traditional rivals Sandhurst, for the 26th occasion in 2026.

During his lifetime, Graeme Wright made an outstanding contribution to football and his beloved South Bendigo Football Club. Graeme was a person of impeccable character who was widely respected and loved by the local football community.

Graeme gave 27 years of dedicated service to his club as a player, coach, team runner, and performed several off-field roles. He tragically passed away in 1998 at the age of 38.

Graeme rose through the junior ranks to ultimately be appointed as South's youngest ever Senior coach. He played his first senior game at the age of 18 and went on to play a total of 144 games before persistent knee injuries prematurely ended his playing career at the start of the 1987 season.

Graeme had a distinguished interleague career

having represented Bendigo between 1982 and 1985. He played in nine representative sides, was Captain in 1983, and after his playing career ended was appointed as Coach in 1992.

Graeme was always known as a dedicated club man and loyal teammate who gave everything that he could to the Bloods both on and off the field and is duly recognised in the BFNL Hall of Fame.

It is fantastic to see how many clubs honour previous BFNL club champions and their respective significant service, days like today are invaluable for past players, members, families, and spectators to remain connected with their BFNL clubs to honour and recognise club history, but also to respect and support the current and future sustainability of BFNL clubs and the important role they play in our local communities.

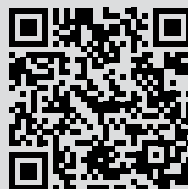

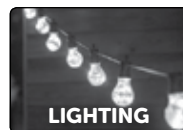

# Round Preview

## **The Graeme Wright Memorial Cup is up for grabs as South Bendigo tackles Sandhurst in round six in Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy.**

It's also second against first on the Bloods' turf at Harry Trott Oval.

Sandhurst holds the Cup which honours one of South Bendigo's great defenders of the 1980s, a former coach, and popular clubman.

The Graeme Wright Memorial Cup was first played for in 1998 and the Wright family involvement with South Bendigo across senior and junior level stretches more than four decades.

A Bloods' attack which includes Brock Harvey, Alex Smith and Mac Cameron takes on a tight-knit defence that includes Liam Ireland, Jack Keating and Darcy Mills.

On-ball duels will be a highlight as South Bendigo has Callum Crisp, Coen Harker and Brody Haddow up against Connor Sexton, Lachie Hood and James Coghlan.

Bloods' defenders Will Allen, Ollie Turnbull and Jack Fallon face a big task against Tom Campbell, Cobi Maxted and Jacob Austin.

Another big match will be on Gisborne's turf at Melbourne North Truck Centre Oval in Gardiner Reserve where the Bulldogs take on Eaglehawk.

A three-one record has the Rob Waters-coached Gisborne in third place.

The Bulldogs fought back to beat Castlemaine by a point last Saturday.

Another massive test for Gisborne against the reigning premier which will be fighting to avoid a hat-trick of defeats.

Highlight of the Bulldogs and Hawks showdown will be the centre ball-ups which could feature four Michelsen medallists.

Gisborne ruckman Braidon Blake and ruck-rover Brad Bernacki face an Hawks' on-ball line-up led by on-ballers and league medallists in Billy Evans and Noah Wheeler.

Gisborne forwards Pat McKenna, Harry Luxmoore,

Zac Denahy and Matt Merrett will test the Hawks in all quarters.

The Borough's defence is led by Charlie Langford, Jonty Neaves, Aydan Hanley and Jack Donat.

Other players to watch in the red, white and blue are captain and key defender Zac Vescovi, James Gray, Thomas Werner and Dylan Johnstone.

Big roles for the Hawks will be played by Joel Mullen, Ben Thompson and ruckman Callum Heath.

The in-form Strathfieldsaye is back on its turf at Triple M Park to take on Broadford.

By 5pm the Jeff Andrews-coached Storm may have surged to the third rung, depending on what happens on Gisborne's ground.

Strathfieldsaye's pressure was superb in a 69-62 on Eaglehawk's turf at C & M Oval in Canterbury Park last round.

An attack which features James Schischka, Tyson McKenzie and Zach Charles could be in for a big afternoon.

Storm is likely to have plenty of scoring chances set up by the likes of Jaidi Jackson-Leahy, Darcy and Riley Mulquiny and Zane Keighran.

In defence Storm has Kya Lanfranchi, Cooper Jones and Patrick Blandford capable of winning many one-in-one contests, but also rebounding strongly.

Another massive test for the Nathan Thompson-coached Broadford which had a rest last Saturday as the Roos played South Bendigo in the stand-alone season opener on March 28.

The Kangaroos worked hard to score nine goals at Kangaroo Flat in the Pat Cronin Foundation Round feature match.

A goal will be to limit the amount of goals scored against when Storm has momentum.

Key players for Broadford include Rhys Carman, Riley Edwards, Jaiden Magor, captain Adam Miles, Seb Morris, Isaac Smithwick and Louis Thompson.

Golden Square will be looking to continue its

dominance against Kangaroo Flat when these clubs clash at Gourmet Pantry Oval in Golden Square's Wade Street.

It's been many seasons since the Kangaroos have taken the points against the Bulldogs.

A one-three record has Golden Square in seventh place, but just a win behind the fifth-placed Eaglehawk.

Rested by the bye, Golden Square will have taken plenty of confidence from its round four hit-out against Sandhurst at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

Inaccuracy cost the blue and gold as it scored 6.13 in a 28-point loss.

Players to watch for the Square include Harry and Jayden Burke, Terry Reeves, Jordan Rosengren, Jack Stewart and Noah Warfe.

Kangaroo Flat could gain an edge through the ruckwork of Angus Macpherson as he teams up with Aaron Nevins, Mitch Collins and Jeremy Rodi.

In attack the Roos have Max Johnson, Nick Keogh and Kyle Symons to test the Bulldogs.

Castlemaine has the bye.

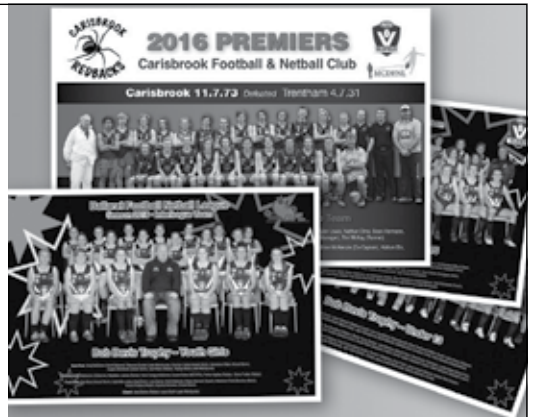

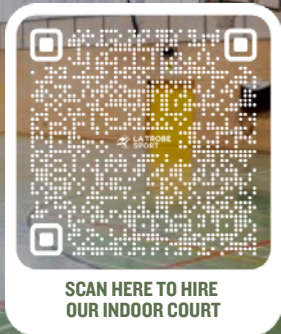

# Reflections...

with Richard Jones



## Bloods on-field leaders late 1920s, early 1930s

**South Bendigo needed to re-group after some quiet years in the late 1920s and with the appointment of Angus McIsaac as playing coach in 1928 their committee hoped the club would stage a revival.**

Early in that season the Bloods newsletter and club notes praised McIsaac as “bidding well to being a big factor in steering the club this season.

McIsaac was quite big for the time, standing 6 ft. 1 inch (185 cm) and weighing 13 stone (82.55 kg). The newsletter also mentioned he had a reach of 8 ft 3 ins. (2.51m). The newsletter describes him as “lanky but with a good disposition, and also a determined player who delivers the goods.”

He'd come to South after five seasons with VFL club Richmond. And followed in the steps of another Tiger in BFL Legend Bob McCaskill who'd joined Sandhurst and was to take the Maroons to a string of premierships in a row in the early to mid-1930s.

One thing I discovered when researching the McIsaac story was that --- like McCaskill --- he dearly loved wearing his old yellow and black Tigers' guernsey to training sessions.

There's always something new which pops up when you're researching old BFNL stories.

McIsaac first learned to play footy at Assumption College, Kilmore --- one of the great school sports nurseries.

According to the South notes he showed an aptitude early for the game and at the age of 14 he was playing for the Kilmore senior team in the

Midlands Football Association.

He'd only racked up a handful of games when WW1 broke out in 1914, but college footy carried on throughout those war years with Assumption beaten just four times in the four war-time seasons.

An amazing record. McIsaac was assigned a backline role by the coach and the side produced some really talented players.

Among them were Essendon star Greg Stockdale who was a prolific goalscorer for the Dons, Leo Dwyer (North Melbourne), Pat Kennedy (Carlton) and James Stockdale (Echuca, in the then BFL).

McIsaac returned to his family farm home in Mooroopna and because his father had played centre (midfield) for Mooroopna in the Goulburn Valley League the club sought out the son.

Mac stripped for the club in 1919 and played so well that he received an offer to go to (then) VFL club Melbourne.

But he stayed in the GVFL although Mooroopna could not turn finals appearances into a flag. McIsaac was often opposed to Bob McCaskill, the Shepparton captain, in matches-of-the-day.

The eventual Sandhurst F.C. history-maker was one of the stars of Goulburn Valley footy and ironically both men signed up with Richmond, went down to the Punt Road oval, became friends and then quite a bit later found themselves opponents on Bendigo's Upper Reserve.

But before the BFL period McIsaac every week regularly made the trip from Mooroopna to

Melbourne each Friday night to take his place in the Tigers' team on Saturdays.

Like the BFL, the Goulburn Valley competition contested their matches on Wednesdays so that schedule allowed players from many Victorian centres to play footy in Melbourne on Saturday afternoons.

No night footy back then, no Thursday or Friday night matches and definitely no footy whatsoever on Sundays.

But the VFL brought in a new rule in 1924 prohibiting a league footballer from playing in two places in the same season.

Unfortunately for Mclsaac he wasn't told in time about the new ruling, so after one Collingwood-Richmond fixture the Magpies protested to the VFL about the Tigers winning the match with ineligible Mclsaac in their side.

The VFL ordered him to stand down. So he went home and played for Mooroopna in the '24 finals but the whole saga wasn't over.

The VFL brought him before its match committee at the beginning of 1925 and he was ordered to stand down indefinitely "at the League's pleasure."

It wasn't until mid-1926 that Mclsaac started playing with Richmond again, but somehow he'd fitted GVFL games into his busy playing schedule and Mooroopna won premierships in 1923--1924.

When interviewed by the editor of the South club newsletter Mclsaac said he considered Danny Minogue (another former BFL star with long-gone club California Gully) Richmond's best coach and also mentioned former BFL players McCormack, Fincher and the Beares as great teammates.

The South editor asked Mclsaac his impressions of his new South Bendigo side. "The young men of South Bendigo form a likely-looking team, fast and full of vigour and I'd say we'll be hard to beat."

"Other than football 'Mac' has gone in for all sorts of sports including tennis, golf, swimming and fishing. During his ramblings he has included fire brigade work among his activities and gained a few trophies with the Mooroopna Fire Brigade.

"He is a good all-round, clean sportsman and as such Bendigo football followers will be delighted to have him here to watch his football and observe his leadership," the article concluded.

Following Mclsaac's time at the Bloods the South committee appointed another playing coach in the early 1930s.

He was Gerald McKenzie who'd joined the Bloods in 1925, played during Mclsaac's coaching period, and was the first locally-produced South footballer to be appointed paid playing coach of the side in 1931.

And again in the flowery written style of the period the South newsletter reported that McKenzie was "well-known for his sterling qualities as a footballer, sportsman and gentleman."

"Mac lived up to every inch of his reputation and your committee and players fully appreciate the fine manner in which he carries out his duties."

Note: South went down in the 1931 grand final, McKenzie's first season as playing coach: Sandhurst 10.14 (74) def. South Bendigo 8.14 (62).

They didn't win another BFL flag until 1950, but that was the start of a stellar stretch during which time they won five grand finals in seven seasons including a nailbiter in 1955 ---- a one-point victory over Sandhurst: 10.7 (77) to the Hurst's 9.12 (66).

Flags in 1950 and '51 and again in 1954, '55 and '56 (the Melbourne Olympics year). All during super-coach Alan "The Fox" McDonald's period in charge.

His talents and leadership also saw him shine beyond the club, representing the BFNL as both an interleague Captain and Coach, and earning selection in the BFNL Team of the Decade, where he was named at Half Back Flank. In recognition of his contribution and lasting legacy, the Graeme Wright Memorial Cup was established in 1998, a tribute to the impact he had on the club and the wider football community. Graeme's influence continues today through his family. He is the proud father of Brad and Chris Wright and Emma Tomlins (née Wright), and his legacy lives on through several of his grandchildren who are now making their mark in South Bendigo's junior ranks.

Graeme Wright's passion, leadership, and loyalty have left an enduring mark on the South Bendigo Football Netball Club - his name and legacy are deeply woven into the club's proud history.
