Interleague Review

WOW. What a day last Saturday was for the Bendigo Football Netball League hosting fellow country Victorian Major League, the Ovens & Murray FNL.

With three matches of netball - 15 & Under, 17 & Under & Open and two matches of football - Under 18's and Seniors, fans were treated to the best of the best in community sport with all five teams playing hard all the way to the end.

Our 15&U and 17&U teams each got off to a slow start but stormed back bravely to fall agonisingly short losing by a goal each. Best on court for the 15&U was Sandhurst's Sienna Raco while Strathfieldsaye's Sophie McDermott was judged best on court for the BFNL in the 17&U match.

Our Under 18 footballers will rue poor accuracy in front goal, controlling large portions of the game against a classy O&M team. The squad led, by captain Anthony Gray (South Bendigo) managed more scoring shots than their opponent but unfortunately fell short by 15 points. Golden Square's Josh Kelly was named as best on ground for the BFNL, winning the Robert O'Connell Medal.

Our Open age netballers really are the jewel in our crown. Coached by Gisborne's Tarryn Rymer, the squad assembled only twice before match day but that didn't matter as they ruthlessly put the O&M to the sword,

controlling much of the match in front of a strong crowd to claim a 34-goal victory. Kangaroo Flat's Ruby Barkmeyer was named as the best on court and was presented her medal by BFNL Hall of Fame Member, Carol Sing.

Next up was the Senior match which was one of the most highly anticipated community football matches I can remember.

Led by head coach Simon Rosa and his team of Assistants, Troy Coates, Nathan Thompson, Bryce Curnow, Wayne Mitrovic, Tyrone Downie & Nick Carter, our final team of 22 players that was led by Captain Fergus Greene, fully committed to the meaning of wearing the BFNL jumper and

Indigenous Round – Round 7

Round 7 of our 2026 season is our annual Indigenous Round where all our senior football and A-Grade netball teams will once again be dressed in their respective custom designed Indigenous uniforms which players and fans have become familiar with.

We are grateful and honoured to continue our partnership with Djaara, highlighted by the annual Indigenous themed round played on Dja Dja Wurrung Country which has been developed through ongoing partnerships between members of Djaara, the Bendigo FNL and AFL Central Victoria.

The round is being held during National Reconciliation Week (27 May – 3 June), this year featuring the Golden Square and South Bendigo Football Netball Clubs at Wade Street as the feature match. This match brings together Central Victorian Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal members to provide an opportunity for continual learning, whilst paying recognition to the living Aboriginal culture of the traditional owners, the Dja Dja Wurrung.

BFNL Indigenous Round is a much anticipated and ever-developing marquee event for the BFNL, bringing the community together and using local football and netball as a platform to initiate continued conversation and further promote a deeper education surrounding respective local Indigenous history, highlighted by all BFNL clubs

competing in the custom designed football and netball uniforms.

This year, a few BFNL Clubs have done a fantastic job, using their local indigenous contacts to design and create new football jumpers and/or netball dresses.

Both Golden Square and South Bendigo will be wearing brand new designs for their feature match today with explanations of their designs in this Record.

Djaara (Dja Dja Wurrung People) have lived on our traditional lands and cared for djandak (Country) over many thousands of years.

Today, we will take part in a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony on djandak. We thank Djaara for sharing Cultural knowledge through language, presentations, on Country talks.

The theme for National Reconciliation Week 2026 is All In, a call for all Australians to commit wholeheartedly to reconciliation every single day.

All In makes clear that reconciliation is not a spectator sport and that all of us must step away from the sidelines and take action to make change.

As customary for the annual BFNL Indigenous Round feature matches, Eaglehawk and Sandhurst senior teams will be playing for the Wirama Shield in both football and netball, with individual awards presented to those players judged best afield for their respective teams.

Under 18 and Reserve's football matches will commence 30 minutes ahead of the regular schedule today to allow us to involve all football and netball playing groups, along with officiating umpires, BFNL, and Djaara, in our customary on-field acknowledgement of country smoking ceremony.

Indigenous Round

Golden Square

As Written by Artist Mikayla Franklin

My artwork represents the connection between animals, journeys, and community. I used the kangaroo, emu, and eagle because they are important Australian native animals that each symbolise different strengths — The kangaroo represents movement and survival, the emu represents wisdom and guidance, and the eagle represents protection and vision.

The kangaroo can also symbolise strength, survival, movement, and connection to the land. Kangaroos represent travelling across Country or providing food and life.

The emu is commonly linked to wisdom, endurance, and the land. Emus can represent guidance, family, or seasonal knowledge because they move across large areas of Country.

The Eagle usually symbolises vision, protection, power, and spirituality. Eagles are often seen as guardians who watch over the land from above.

The kangaroo tracks around the painting show movement and journeys. Animal tracks in Aboriginal art often tell the story of where animals travelled, hunted, or gathered. They can also symbolise pathways between places and connections between living things.

The meeting place is a very important symbol in Aboriginal art. Concentric circles usually represent a campfire, waterhole, ceremony site, or gathering place where people and animals meet.

The lines connecting to the pathway or songlines. These represent journeys across Country and the connection between different places, animals, and communities.



South Bendigo

My name is Kira Bice. I am a proud Yidinji, Guggandji and Takalaka woman who was born and raised on Dja Dja Wurrung land here in Bendigo. I have taken inspiration for this design from Djarra land and my time as a previous netballer at South Bendigo.

The design in the middle represents a meeting place which is was netball is, we come together to play the sport we love and to support one another within our club. To the top and bottom are symbols that represent women as an ode to the matriarchs that hold Aboriginal culture strong but women in general are also an integral part of sport and clubs and community, particularly at South where women supporting other women is at the forefront. Along the top and bottom are waves that represent water that surrounds Bendigo and links the community and people and lastly the lines and dots that are shaded represent the children and other loved ones in our lives.

Round Preview



GOLDEN Square faces a huge challenge against the ladder-leading South Bendigo in the marquee match of Indigenous Round across Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy action.

As the league marks the contribution of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders to our great game, Golden Square and South Bendigo renew a great rivalry forged in many great contests.

The fifth-placed Golden Square has the running power to test the Bloods at Gourmet Pantry Oval in Wade Street.

Sustaining the pressure across four quarters was something the Bulldogs could not do against Sandhurst or reigning premier Eaglehawk.

The Bulldogs have ruckman Liam Hoy, Jordan Rosengren, Terence Reeves and Harry Burke capable of winning many contests.

There's also the excitement generated by younger players such as Archie and Macey Eaton, Tommi Turner and Noah Warfe.

It's the start of a gruelling three-week stretch for the Brad Eaton and Liam Barrett-coached Bulldogs as they take on South Bendigo, play at Strathfieldsaye on King's Birthday weekend, and then host Gisborne in round nine.

Key players for the blue and gold in Jayden Burke, Jack Stewart and Tom Strauch were superb as Bendigo beat Ovens and Murray in the inter-league match.

South Bendigo rolls into this contest following an eight-goal win against Sandhurst to reclaim the Graeme Wright Memorial Cup.

The height and marking power of Callum Crisp and Mac Cameron in the ruck or attack will be a major threat for Golden Square.

Other key players for the Troy Coates and Jack Fallon-coached Bloods include Brody Haddow, Will Allen, Tom Templeton, Zac Hare, Coen Harker and Josh Nitschke.

After crossing from Sandhurst, Jack English has quickly become a key playmaker for the Bloods.

It's a huge match for Eaglehawk and Castlemaine

on the Borough's turf at C & M Oval in Canterbury Park.

It's seventh against sixth as both teams are locked on eight premierships points.

The Hawks have not had a bye.

In the past two rounds Eaglehawk was beaten by seven points at home by Strathfieldsaye and then at Gisborne's Gardiner Reserve.

Back on home turf and before a parochial crowd the Travis Matheson and Clayton Holmes-coached Eaglehawk will be desperate to avoid a hat-trick of defeats.

Key players for the Two Blues include ruckman Callum Heath, Billy Evans, Ben Thompson, Charlie Langford, Oscar White and Bailey Ilsley.

The Bailey Henderson-coached Castlemaine took it right up to Gisborne in the fifth round.

Key forward Michael Hartley was in great form for Bendigo against O and M and will again be a major focus of Eaglehawk's defensive plans.

Other players to watch for the Magpies include Harrison Sheahan, Hunter Staples, Dylan Landt, Zack Derksen and Zavier Murley.

Broadford is on its turf at Harley Hammond Reserve to take on Gisborne.

The Nathan Thompson-coached Kangaroos keep working hard on team defence.

Was a tough hit-out for Broadford at Strathfieldsaye last round.

Best for the Kangas in Storm territory were Adam Miles, Taiten Thomas, Riley Edwards and Louis Thompson.

Huge test for Broadford against the Rob Waters-coached Gisborne which has on-batters Dylan Johnstone, James Gray and Brad Bernacki, and forwards Pat McKenna and Zac Denahy in great form.

Bulldogs' captain Zac Vescovi showed why he is one of the competition's best defenders against the O and M attack.

It's a stand-alone match on Sunday between Sandhurst and Strathfieldsaye at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

The Bryce Curnow and Fergus Greene-coached Sandhurst is on the rebound from its first defeat of the season.

Expect a spirited response from a Dragons team which had Caleb Connick, Fergus Greene, Lachie Hood, Cobi Macted and Lachlan Wright represent the league.

The Dragons' squad includes Tom Campbell, Liam Ireland and Darcy Mills.

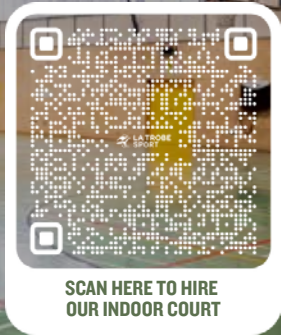

Reflections...

Four seasons completed in World War 2 era

It's no surprise to learn that Bendigo footy only went ahead in the first three years of World War 2.

Those were the 1939, 1940 and 1941 seasons as the BFL went into recess and only sparked up again as WW2 ended in 1945.

There was a Bendigo footy season in 1945 as the war was seen as winding up.

So there was no Bendigo footy from 1942 to 1944 with the new era sparking up again in 1945 with Germany surrendering in May, but Japan not winding up until the atomic bomb assaults on Hiroshima and Nagasaki in early August '45.

So let's go back to 1939-40 and look at what happened to the footy competition.

Of course all clubs had footy players signing up for the Aussie armed forces, and lack of numbers allied with fuel rationing and food supply shortages meant clubs were well down in numbers.

But even so as 1940 loomed the BFL had a full complement of eight clubs.

Echuca East had joined the league which meant there was no bye, but as the season got underway no one was sure how East would compete.

Square entered the season as reigning premiers --- they'd won in 1938 and '39 --- and started their season with a big win over Sandhurst.

After three rounds Eaglehawk and Hurst were bottom two and even Square was struggling after the early win.

It was a madcap season as all sides continued to lose players who were enlisting to fight in the armed services.

Even after a footy carnival where the proceeds went to war funds, travel and lack of players claimed Echuca East.

By the end of June Kyneton, Rochester and Maryborough had all withdrawn, also, with shortages of players and petrol rationing and high costs of filling up buses the big impacts on the country clubs.

So it was back to a four-club competition so each club knew they had a definite finals spot in place.

Sandhurst sat in last position, but was still dangerous and proved it by toppling ladder leader South Bendigo in a home-and-away round.

Coach Bob McCaskill had his revenge over eventual fellow BFNL Hall of Fame Legend Reg Ford when the Maroons knocked Golden Square out of the finals with a first semi-final win.

They had to down Eaglehawk to meet season stand-outs South in the grand final and, although the Hurst almost kicked themselves out of contention, won a grannie thriller on the last kick of the day: 13.18 to 13.13.

The Bloods snatched an early lead and controlled the grannie up to half-time. But McCaskill, in what turned out to be his last full season of BFL footy, led the Maroons to their second half ascendancy by booting two majors himself early in the third term.

There was just a kick or two in it for the rest of the

grannie, and the Maroons only got home when Theo Hellwege snapped a major over his shoulder from 45 yards/metres out to seal the Sandhurst victory.

That was McCaskill's final Hurst flag because he moved to Melbourne and was to forge important contributions at both North Melbourne and Hawthorn.

He coached North from 1941 to 1947 and the Hawks from 1950 to '52. McCaskill led North to their first VFL finals appearance in 1945, remembering that North, along with Hawthorn and Footscray, had only joined the VFL (later the AFL) from the VFA in 1925.

But in the BFL McCaskill had spent 15 seasons with Sandhurst, taking them to nine premierships from 12 grand finals ---- a record unlikely to ever be touched, let alone equalled, in BFNL history.

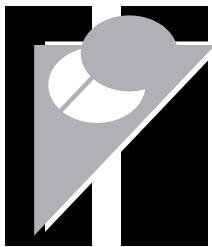

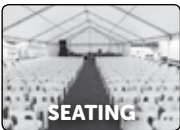
