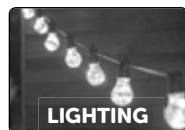

A clash of top two teams Strathfieldsaye and South Bendigo highlights round 10 in Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy.

Both teams are on seven-one records rolling into a crucial showdown on South Bendigo's turf at Harry Trott Oval.

South Bendigo's sole defeat in '26 was to Strathfieldsaye by seven points in Storm territory at Triple M Park in Tannery Lane on Good Friday.

Since a 35-point loss at Gisborne in round three, Storm has surged to top spot and is on a six-game winning streak.

Both teams are stacked with plenty of talent in midfield and on-ball.

Key players for the Bloods include Coen Harker, Brody Haddow, Nathan Kay and Josh Nitschke.

In defence Will Allen has had an outstanding season at centre half-back and co-coach Jack Fallon provides plenty of run from the back half.

Last season's Ron Best medallist as leading goalkicker, Brock Harvey kicked six goals in South Bendigo's latest victory against Kangaroo Flat.

Top ruckmen Mac Cameron and Callum Crisp did not play against the Kangaroos.

Non-playing co-coach of the Bloods, Troy Coates is up against a club where he achieved premiership success as a playing coach.

Storm's attack is brilliantly led by Josh Nitschke, Zach Charles and Pat Blake.

Best in Strathfieldsaye's win at Kangaroo Flat last Saturday were Ethan Featherby, Daniel Clohesy, Riley Mulquiny and the classy Tyson McKenzie.

Another big match will be at Queen Elizabeth Oval where Sandhurst takes on Eaglehawk.

It's the rematch of last season's grand finalists.

Depth of both squads has been severely tested by injury all season.

In a great sign for now and the future, Sandhurst's youngsters who are coached by Bryce Curnow, non-playing, and Fergus Greene, playing, have performed exceptionally well.

Oliver Stewart kicked three goals and was best afield in last Saturday's win against Castlemaine on the QEO turf.

Players to watch for the Dragons include Cooper Smith, ruckman Hugh Schmetzer, Lachie Hood, Harrison Free, Wil Pinniger and Cobi Maxted.

Eaglehawk regained its place in the top five as it chases back-to-back premierships.

On Easter Saturday the Hawks battled to halt the Dragons' run in a 38-point loss on the Borough's turf in Canterbury Park.

Key players for the Borough include premiership-winning captain and Michelsen medallist Billy Evans, ruckman Callum Heath, Ben Thompson, Joel Mullen, Jonty Neaves and Jack O'Shannessy.

Huge match for both clubs in the fight to reclaim a place or stay in touch with the top five.

A Golden Square team coached by Brad Eaton, non-playing, and Liam Barrett, playing, is on a two-six record and will be desperate to take the points after an eight-point loss at Castlemaine on Good Friday.

The play of Jordan Rosengren, ruckman Liam Hoy, Isaac Corvo, Tom Strauch, Jack Stewart and key defender Noah Warfe will have a major bearing on Golden Square's chances.

In his first season as playing coach, Bailey Henderson has Castlemaine on the sixth rung on a three-five record.

The Magpies have beaten the three teams below them on the ladder, but none of those perched in the top five.

Michael Hartley kicked a season-high 15 goals a fortnight ago and looms as huge threat to the Bulldogs' defence.

The quality and quantity of supply will be led by Dylan Landt, Harrison Sheahan, Jack Chester,

Kalan Huntly, Ben McConachy, and captain Darby Semmens.

Kangaroo Flat is back at Bendigo Mazda Oval in Dower Park to take on Gisborne.

Another huge challenge for the Tyrone Downie-coached Kangaroos who have played South Bendigo and Strathfieldsaye the past two rounds.

On Good Friday it was Gisborne which beat the Kangaroos by 20 goals at Gardiner Reserve.

Kangaroo Flat will be determined for a far more competitive showing on its ground.

Key players for Kangaroo Flat include Mitch Collins, Nick Keogh, Max Johnson, ruckman Angus Macpherson, and the hard-running Aaron Nevins.

It's consecutive road trips for Gisborne which won at Golden Square last Saturday by 23 points.

A talented Gisborne squad coached by Rob Waters includes Michelsen medallists Brad Bernacki and Braidon Blake, gun forward Pat McKenna, Shane Clough, Jed and Zac Denahy, and captain and key defender Zach Vescovi.

Broadford has the bye.

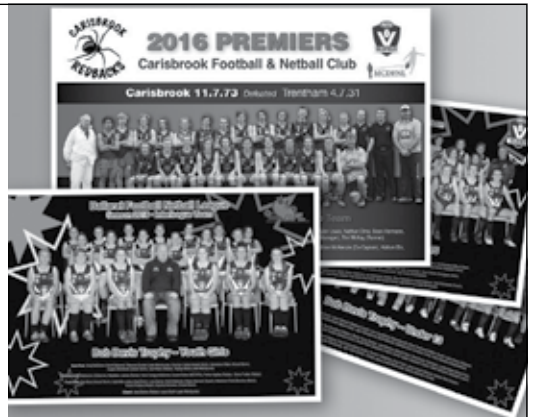

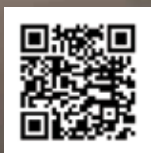

Reflections...

Bendigo footy after World War 1 wound up

I've taken readers through footy leading up to, and in a few years during, World War 2 so now it's timely to look back even further --- World War 1, and straight before and straight after.

Footy was played during the first year-and-a-bit of WW1 (1914 and a portion of 1915), but after the 1915 season started with great hopes for a big year the inevitable drain of players was too significant and the newly-named BFL went into recess.

Rochester had come in for the 1915 season, replacing California Gully, and was on top of the ladder when the league went into recess in July.

There had been a few colourful seasons leading up to the Great War. Long Gully left the league in 1912 and were replaced by brand new club Bendigo City.

This team was formed through the amalgamation of the Kennington and Central Districts junior clubs and league officials were sure they'd be a very talented side.

But there were other matters on club and league officials' minds that 1913 season. Leading up to the annual Bendigo vs. VFL clash set down for July 3rd there was heated controversy about the local players selection issues.

Selectors tasked with naming Bendigo's side seemed to have ignored quality players from the top two clubs --- South and Eaglehawk --- and the rep. side was therefore much weaker.

The vitriolic criticism was justified with the Bendigo side totally overwhelmed --- VFL 18.11 (119) def. Bendigo 4.5 (29).

Of course the competition name changed in 1913, an important year. The old Bendigo Footy

Association name was turfed and in came the present day Bendigo Football League.

South was the pacesetter in the opening half of that 1913 season, belting Cal Gully by 75 points with Bendigo City showing it was going to be a power club with a close loss to Eaglehawk.

City had an imposing forward line, a fact underlined just before the finals when they thrashed Cal Gully.

Forward Dave Mahoney, who would go on and play VFL footy with Richmond, nailed a massive 24 goals of his side's 30. Mahoney's tally, only equalled by Eaglehawk spearhead Harry Morgan 40 years later against Rochester, still stands as the equal individual BFNL record.

And City went on to take home the 1913 premiership cup with their grand final win over South, but World War 1 would soon put a stop to all sports activities.

But by April-May of 1919, with WW1 over, footy returned to Bendigo.

South hosted new club Bendigo East, who wore black and white colours similar to Collingwood's, while Eaglehawk was host to re-formed Sandhurst at Canterbury Park.

It was May 3rd so the BFL committee and club administrators had taken a while to get things up and running.

Interestingly, my research has uncovered a completely forgotten sidelight to the re-formed Sandhurst F.C.

It was basically an up-market side from the old Lerggo's team which had played in the trades

competition during the war. So whether it was actually a new club or a continuation of the old, historic club founded in 1861 raged a bit in that post-war era.

All clubs had members and players who had died during WW1. South played one match wearing black armbands in memory of Captain H.H. Hunter, a former player and later BFL president, who had lost his life on Europe's battlefields.

Hurst and the Two Blues finished equal on premiership points at the end of that 1919 season which meant a play-off had to be staged to determine the BFL's minor premiers.

Eaglehawk fought hard to overhaul a three-quarter time deficit but in the end went down by three points.

So, onto the finals. Hurst met third-placed South in the grannie and was tipped by all pundits to finish a dream debut with a flag.

But after an amazingly low scoring encounter in front of a massive Upper Reserve crowd just five goals in total were landed.

South's straighter kicking for goal got them home by a single point: 3.7 (25) to Sandhurst's 2.12 (24).

And so with the return of footy it meant many families could gradually get back to normal through the Twenties.

Although unbeknown to everyone, another catastrophe loomed at the of the 1920s and the start of the 1930s: the world wide economic Depression.

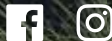
