Round Preview

Having dropped to the fourth rung on the ladder, South Bendigo's Bloods face a huge test on Gisborne's Gardiner Reserve in the 11th round of Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL senior footy.

The Bloods are on the rebound from defeat for just the second time this season after a 27-point loss to Strathfieldsaye.

Back in round two South Bendigo won a thrilling contest with Gisborne.

The Bloods were up 91-89 when the siren sounded to end the clash at Kennington's Harry Trott Oval. Gisborne's only defeat at home this season was to Sandhurst by 11 points on the King's Birthday holiday weekend.

The past two rounds the Bulldogs have made their way north to win at Golden Square by 23 points and then at Kangaroo Flat by 182 points.

Gisborne's attacking power was to the fore against the Roos.

A tally of 31 goals included 10 by Pat McKenna and five by Dominic Sullivan.

The Bulldogs forwards will be up against Will Allen, Sam Langley, co-coach Jack Fallon and James Davies.

On-ball contests will again be a highlight of this Gisborne and South Bendigo showdown.

The Rob Waters-coached Gisborne has Brad Bernacki, Adam Brancatisano and Shane Clough in great form.

With gun ruckman Braidon Blake on the sidelines it's been Boyd Nalder who competes strongly every time.

The Bloods will have Callum Crisp working to tap the ball to Brody Haddow, Coen Harker and Tom Templeton.

Eaglehawk and Castlemaine face crucial matches as they fight for the fifth rung.

The Hawks hold fifth place by percentage rolling into their match on Golden Square's ground at Gourmet Pantry Oval.

Eaglehawk is on the rebound from a 21-point loss to Sandhurst.

In round two the Travis Matheson and Clayton Holmes-coached Eaglehawk beat Golden Square at C and M Oval in Canterbury Park by 27 points.

The Borough will look for big games from the likes of captain and Michelsen medallist Billy Evans, ruckman Callum Heath, and Joel Mullen.

In attack the Hawks have Bailey Ilsley and Jack O'Shannessy as strong marking targets.

It's a hat-trick of home games for Golden Square. In the past two rounds the Bulldogs have been defeated by Gisborne and Castlemaine.

Key players for the blue and gold include co-coach Liam Barrett, ruckman Liam Hoy, Carson James, Jordan Rosengren and Jack Stewart.

The return of Michelsen medallist and four-time premiership player Adam Baird is a huge plus for

a Golden Square team which has Brad Eaton as non-playing coach.

Castlemaine will be determined to build on the momentum of last week's victory as it faces Kangaroo Flat at The Railway Hotel Oval in Camp Reserve.

The Bailey Henderson-coached Magpies will start favourite against the Kangaroos.

In round two Castlemaine won at Bendigo Mazda Oval in Dower Park by 88 points.

A Magpies' attack led by Michael Hartley and Kalan Huntly will test the Kangaroos.

At centre bounces Jaise Coleman will team up with Dylan Landt, Hunter Staples and Bailey Henderson.

After encouraging form the previous two rounds against South Bendigo and Strathfieldsaye the Tyrone Downie-coached Kangaroos could not halt Gisborne's four-quarter blitz.

Effort is the key for the Kangaroos rolling into this contest with the Magpies.

The play of Mitch Collins, Max Johnson, Jake Hywood, Nick Keogh, Nick Lang, Angus Macpherson, Jordan and Zach Rouse will go a long way toward Kangaroo Flat keeping the heat on in every quarter.

Broadford returns from the bye to host Sandhurst at Harley Hammond Reserve.

It's another big step on the learning curve for a young Broadford team coached by Nathan Thompson.

Best for the Kangaroos in their latest hit-out with Eaglehawk were Louis Thompson, Adam Miles, Riley Edwards, Jacob Street-Glasson, Charles Neilson and Oliver Lubeck.

Sandhurst has shown its considerable depth across the past three rounds where it has won at Gisborne and beaten Castlemaine and Eaglehawk at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

It's many of the lesser-lights who have shone in the Dragons' run.

In-form players for Sandhurst include Liam Ireland, Jaxon Howard, Oliver Morris and Wil Pinniger.

A team which has Bryce Curnow as non-playing co-coach and Fergus Greene as playing co-coach also has the running power and skill of Cooper Smith, Lachie Hood, Caleb Connick and Dayten Uerata.

Strathfieldsaye has the bye.

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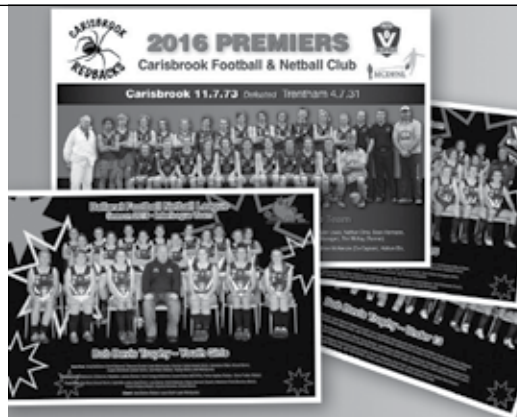


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Reflections...

Wrap-up of early June matches, 2011

In early June 2011 I wrote up the Maryborough-Kyneton Rd. 8 match for the Bendigo Advertiser.

It seems a bit strange to be looking back at the teams and exploits of two clubs which are no longer with us in the BFNL.

Maybe underneath everything I'm a bit of a footy romantic.

But the long and twisted history of the BFNL includes the exploits and highlights of a number of former clubs: Rochester, Echuca, Lockington-Bamawm among them. So stick with me and I'll recount what happened on that Saturday 14 seasons back.

The match-of-the-day was South Bendigo (2nd) vs. Gisborne (3rd) and I'll come to that match round-up shortly, but first I want to look back at the Kyneton Showgrounds clash.

Down at that very cold Showgrounds Maryborough improved its win-loss record to 4-4 with key forward Matthew Bond and creative on-baller Cole Roscholler each nailing four goals.

The Princes Park Pies were always in complete control with Tigers' ruckman Rhys Ellis booting the home side's only first half major right on the siren which signified the long break.

He marked and kicked straight from deep in the city end goal square. Maryborough already had 12 majors on the board.

And even though the Tigers added five goals after half-time the visiting Pies hammered home nine of their own on their way to a mammoth 21.15 (141) to 6.11 (47) victory. South Bendigo won the-match-of-the-day in an away thriller against Gisborne by nine points to grab outright second place on the BFL ladder ahead of the Gardiner Reserve Dogs, Strath Storm and Eaglehawk.

Bloods' coach Rick Coburn described his side's gutsy victory as one of the club's best home-and-away wins in the past five years.

Full-forward Michael Leech was the hero for South drilling eight goals of their 18, including the sealer just

seconds before the final siren blared out.

"It was a big win for us. Gisborne hasn't been a happy hunting ground for us in recent years," Coburn said.

"In 2009 we lost a game at Gisborne we should have won when they ran over the top of us and there were signs of that yet again this time."

"Thankfully the guys found a way to keep their noses in front. So that's as good a win as we've had in a season for quite a while," the coach added.

South controlled the game for the first three quarters, leading 14.4 to 9.12 at the last break, before the home side unleashed a powerful --- if inaccurate --- last term blitz of 5.9.

The home side reduced South's 22-point three quarter time lead to just three points late in the game, but just couldn't hit the front.

Gisborne coach Luke Saunders downplayed his side's late surge.

"We didn't deserve to win. South was clearly the better side and they wanted the win more than we did."

"The scoreboard might show that we were unlucky not to win because of the number of scoring shots we had, but that's not being completely fair to South."

"I thought our last quarter was good but you can't play one quarter of good footy and expect to beat a quality side like South Bendigo," Saunders added.

Leech was the difference between the two clubs. He kicked all of South's four goals in the first term to set up a 13-point lead and with Saunders watching on from the coaching box because of injury, Gisborne lacked a major target inside their forward 50 which Leech provided at the other end of the ground.

While Leech was the matchwinner in attack he wouldn't have seen as much of the ball without the Bloods' mids.

Tom Hams and Brady Childs weren't far behind Leech as far as impacts on the game were concerned. Coburn rated Hams and Childs in their best Top Four on the day.

Darren Farrugia nailed four goals for the Graveyard Dogs. And their best was returning key defender

Anthony Belcher at centre half-back, coming back from injury which had sidelined him for a year-and-a-half.

Tom Waters had a match-long battle with South's Ben Allen in the ruck as they nullified each other at the centre bounces before they both floated across half-back at opposite ends of the ground. They both won plenty of possessions.

In other games that weekend 14 years back Eaglehawk's Matt Gretgrix was at his brilliant best banging home 12 majors in the Two Blues 118-point belting of Castlemaine at Canterbury Park.

Young player Matt Gilmore added his six. He'd been used mainly in the ruck earlier in 2011 but against the Maine he spent most of the day inside the forward 50.

Gretgrix and Gilmore werfe fed all afternoon by mids Troy Coates (now co-coaching South), Anthony Dennis and Josh Bowe (a future Hawks' coach).

Ken Cummings nailed four of the Maine's 10 goals while the huge win boosted Eaglehawk's percentage by nearly 16 per cent to 109.53.

Strath Storm downed Sandhurst by 26 points at Tannery Lane after hammering home 7.4 to two goals in the second term, but the Dragons were weak up forward when kdy goalkicker Matt Thornton tweaked a hamstring early on and didn't play after quarter time.

Square's forwards had a day out against a Kangaroo Fklat without sztar forwards Justin Msddern and Tyrone Downie (the 2025 coach) while top ruckman Nick Lang was injured in the opening term.

Jack Geary gathered 42 possessions for the Square with James Bristow (7 goals) and Grant Weeks (5) dominant in the forward 50 while Nathan Bell Simon Rosa and Luke Rosa were dominant in midfield.

Travis Baird relished his new role playing across half-back and up into the wings. Billy White snared four of the Roos' measly eight majors.

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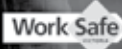

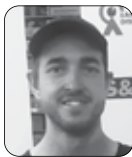
