Today's Round 14 is our annual **TAC Road Safety Round** that encourages football and netball clubs across Victoria to "Band Together" for road safety.

This year, it takes place from Thursday, July 23 to Sunday, July 26, and focuses on the dangers of speeding, which remains one of the major contributors to road trauma in Victoria – a factor in around 30 per cent of fatal crashes and 25 per cent of serious injuries.

So far this year, 140 lives have been lost on Victoria's roads – a 20 per cent reduction on the same time last year, but a reminder that more still needs to be done to keep our roads safe.

Now in its eighth year, Road Safety Round brings road safety conversations directly into more than 1,000 grassroots clubs.

Road Safety Round is a major initiative of the TAC and AFL Victoria's more than 30-year partnership.

Grassroots clubs can earn up to \$10,000 through the \$700,000 Club Rewards Program, for being road safety leaders.



Further club Information and program assets will be rolled out in the coming weeks and knowing the level of BFNL support for this program in recent years I strongly encourage all clubs to again both understand the program and get involved again if possible.

As part of this year's program, clubs will be asked to start conversations and be part of the campaign to raise awareness of the dangers of speeding, with the tagline – "Be the difference".

AFL Victoria's partnership with the TAC provides a connection to regional Victorians urging them to prioritise road safety, ensuring everyone gets to the game safely.

And remember to continue to share the key message of the 2026 campaign - **BE THE DIFFERENCE**

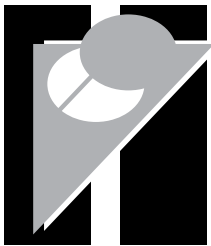

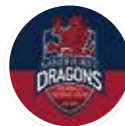

Eaglehawk is the latest team which will try to break Strathfieldsaye's unbeaten run at Triple M Park as the Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL marks round 14 in senior footy action.

Just seven points separated these teams when they met in round five at C and M Oval in Eaglehawk's Canterbury Park.

The Jeff Andrews carries a seven-match winning streak into this contest.

A seven-five record has Eaglehawk in fifth position, but building momentum in its pursuit of back-to-back premierhips.

A Borough line-up coached by Travis Matheson, non-playing, and Clayton Holmes, playing, marked one of its best games of the season as it won last Saturday's home game against South Bendigo by eight goals.

The Hawks did as expected in beating Golden Square and Kangaroo Flat the previous rounds and did so by margins of 102 and 89 points.

On-ball contests will be a highlight of the Storm and Hawks' showdown.

Strathfieldsaye ruckman Tim Hosking takes on Callum Heath who is arguably one of the recruits of the year.

The run and teamwork of Daniel Clohesy, Tyson McKenzie and Jaidi Jackson-Leahy from centre ball-ups and stoppages has played a big part in Storm's success.

Eaglehawk's on-ball options include Michelsen medallist and captain Billy Evans, Ben Thompson, Joel Mullen and another Michelsen medallist in Noah Wheeler.

Playing on a wing, Oscar White kicked six goals in the win against South Bendigo.

In attack Storm has James Schishcka, Zach Charles, Riley Wilson and Pat Blake to test a Hawks' defence led by Jonty Neaves, Charlie Langford, Dylan Hanley and Sam Thompson.

Strathfieldsaye defenders Kya Lanfranchi, Lachlan Ratcliffe, Hunter Lawrence and Patrick Blandford are up against the marking power of Bailey Ilsley, Jacquin Mifsud, Jack O'Shannessy and Nick Thompson.

Rested by the bye, Gisborne will be back at Melbourne North Truck Centre Oval in Gardiner Reserve to take on Castlemaine.

In round five the Rob Waters-coached Gisborne won a top contest at Castlemaine's Camp Reserve by a point.

The Bulldogs are on the rebound from a two-goal loss on Strathfieldsaye's ground.

Players to watch for Gisborne include Pat McKenna at full-forward, ruck-rover Brad Bernacki, Jed Denahy, Shane Clough, Dylan Johnstone and captain Zac Vescovi.

An upset win by Castlemaine will keep the Magpies in the race for the finals as they start

the round eight points behind the fifth-placed Eaglehawk.

Key players for the Magpies include coach Bailey Henderson, Michael Hartley, Callum McConachy, Darby Semmens, Dylan Landt and Hunter Staples.

A gun player with Darwin Buffaloes as a mid/forward, Jarrod Stokes was among the best in his first match for Castlemaine against Storm last Saturday.

Stung by an eight-goal loss, South Bendigo will be back at Harry Trott Oval in Kennington to take on Broadford.

The Bloods kicked off the season by winning the stand-alone match at Broadford's Harley Hammond Reserve by 205 points.

A Bloods' attack led by Brock Harvey, Alex Smith-Ralph and Zaydyn Lockwood is likely to have plenty of scoring chances set up by Brody Haddow, co-coach Jack Fallon, Josh Nitschke and Nathan Horbury.

The South Bendigo line-up which has Troy Coates as non-playing co-coach is locked on 32 points, but 52 per cent behind the third-placed Gisborne.

It's another massive test for a young Broadford team coached by Nathan Thompson.

Best for Broadford in last Saturday's home game against Kangaroo Flat were Angus Hoyne, Harry Behan, captain Adam Miles, Louis Thompson, Brodie Stray and Jarrah Younger.

After a big win on Broadford's turf, Kangaroo Flat returns to Bendigo Mazda Oval in Dower Park to take on Sandhurst.

Key players for the Tyrone Downie-coached Kangaroos include ruckman Angus Macpherson, Nick Keogh, Aaron Nevins, captain Ethan Roberts, Nick Lang and Mitch Collins.

Sandhurst retained the Ron Best Memorial Shield as it won at Golden Square by 44 points.

There's plenty of running power in a Dragons' line-up which includes Cooper Smith, Nick Stagg, Dayten Uerata, Lachie Hood, Caleb Connick, Oliver Morris and Matt Wilkinson.

A team coached by Bryce Curnow, non-playing, and Fergus Greene, playing, is second in the premiership race and has a tough run after this as it plays South Bendigo at the QEO, Strathfieldsaye at Triple M Park, and Gisborne on the QEO.

Golden Square has the bye.

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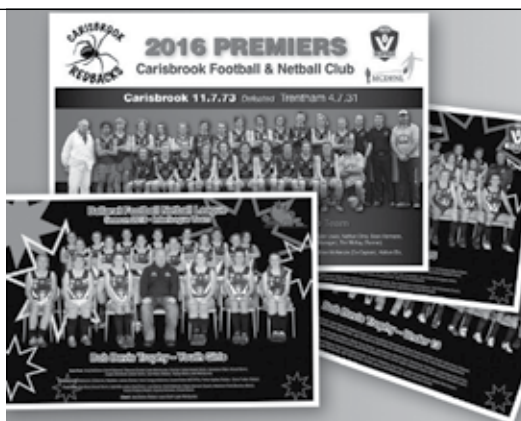


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RISING STAR AWARD 2026

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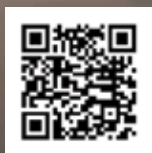

Ledwidge pilots Two Blues to late Sixties flag

Eaglehawk, under eventual BFNL Hall of Fame coach John Ledwidge, went on a late Sixties recruiting drive, the likes of which left local footy followers amazed.

He signed a long line of VFL stars who made their way into the Canterbury Park change rooms.

So 1968 turned out to be a very important and noteworthy season especially since it saw the arrival of BFNL Legend ---- one of only seven so far ---- Ron Best who pulled on the boots for the Square in Round 4.

He was to dominate the then BFL for close to two decades. In Rd. 4 Besty made his debut as a 17-year-old booting an astounding 14.9, starting out on a career which ended with Ron becoming the greatest full-forward the league has ever seen.

Loyal Rochester back pocket defender Darryl Hooper celebrated his 200th BFL game in Rd. 11 versus Eaglehawk, but it wasn't a real celebratory occasion.

The Hawks smashed Rochy to ensure there was no double celebration in the visitors' rooms.

Near the end of the home-and-away rounds Besty nailed 10 majors at the Wade Street ground to reach his maiden league century.

Notably, as described in the Monday Addy, crowds of young and not-so-young footy followers rushed out onto the oval to celebrate the achievement.

It's a scene we see reasonably often these days, but quite rare six decades back.

But Echuca wasn't fazed. Proving that one man --- not even a gun spearhead --- doesn't make a team, the Murray Bombers downed the Square in the '68 first semi-final with the Wade Street Bulldogs held to just six goals.

Of course, Besty nailed four of that tally of six measly majors.

South came out firing in the second semi against Eaglehawk and stayed in front match-long to earn first spot in the grannie.

The Hawks had no counter to the Bloods' pace but few followers, including the Addy experts, expected Echuca to trouble them the next week in the prelim. final.

That proved to be the case and all attention now turned to which of the star-studded grand final sides would have the advantage on the big day.

And even though the Bloods had great on-ballers and century goal-kicker Bob Morton at the spearhead as their focal point., Ledwidge's Hawks won a low scoring grannie by one kick.

1968 grand final scores: Eaglehawk 8.16 (64) def. South Bendigo 8.10 (58).

With the end of the Sixties upon everyone, many involved in. local footy had South as the pre-season favourites for the 1969 flag.

But as the season unfolded it became clear that Echuca was going to be a huge threat with former Sandhurst and Hawthorn great Graham Arthur as the Murray Bombers' coach.

Arthur had taken Echuca to top place on the BFL ladder with Eaglehawk close behind and South and Square making up the Top Four.

In round 17 the goal-kicking star Ron Best kicked his 100th goal against the hapless Castlrmaine at Wade Street and then, just to show how big a threat he'd be in the finals, Besty nailed an amazing 16 snag rolls in the final round down at Kyneton.

It was his top individual tally in his star-studded career.

Nonetheless interest soon switched to the ladder positioning with Echuca on top by a percentage gap to South Bendigo in second spot.

In a tight and tough first semi shootout Besty hammered home eight majors, but Square fell short by six points to Eaglehawk with the Two Blues waiting to see whether they'd face Echuca or South in the preliminary final.

In the end the Bloods won a second semi thriller leaving Eaglehawk to fight it out with Echuca in the '69 preliminary final.

The prelim. was a game for Eaglehawk's Kennedy brothers with full-forward Greg kicking his 100th

goal for the season and brother Jim dominating with 27 disposals and 11 marks.

And then onto the grannie. It was a tough, hard-fought final but not a great spectacle for the huge crowd, although the end three-point result for South was a tighter finish than 12 months earlier.

Bloods' big man Leon Grose was best afield with 25 disposals and 14 marks and close behind was his playing coach Colin Rice who finished with a match-high 32 touches.

Final scores: South Bendigo 10.10 (70) def. E'hawk 9.13 (67).

And so ended a decade which had featured star-studded teams with many former VFL players out on the grounds, but the Seventies were to feature huge challenges for the BFL administrators.

While Besty, Grose and the Kennedys would still snatch headlines in the Bendigo Addy the Rochester and Echuca clubs could not fight off growing anxieties and tensions about continuing on in the BFL.

Before the mid-1970s both had departed, joining the Goulburn Valley F.L.
