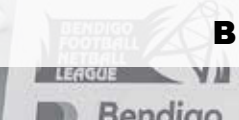

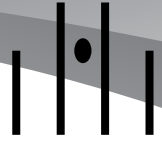

Round Preview



A rematch of last season's senior footy grand finalists, Eaglehawk and Sandhurst on Easter Saturday caps a big weekend of action for the Bendigo Bank Bendigo Football Netball League.

Eaglehawk's parochial fan base will watch the '25 premiership flag be unfurled before the Borough takes on the Dragons at Canterbury Park in round one.

When these clubs met last September it was Eaglehawk which overcame a 22-point deficit at three quarter-time to beat Sandhurst by 10 points at Queen Elizabeth Oval.

Co-coaches Travis Matheson and Clayton Holmes again lead a team which has plenty of premiership winners.

The Hawks have been bolstered by the return of Michelsen medallist Noah Wheeler to join an on-ball brigade which includes captain and last season's Michelsen medallist in Billy Evans, along with Joel Mullen and Ben Thompson.

It will be a different looking attack to the one which met Sandhurst in the grand final.

At Sandhurst there's a change to the coaching structure as Bryce Curnow, non-playing, and Fergus Greene, playing, join forces.

Plenty of height and marking power in this squad through the inclusion of Rory Ellett and Lachlan Watson to join the likes of Lachlan Wright, Cobi Maxted, Hugh Schmetzer, Greene, and Tom Campbell.

Sandhurst also has the running power and skill of Cooper Smith, Lachie Hood, Ollie Morris and Matt Wilkinson to test the Two Blues.

Three matches will be played on Good Friday.

Strathfieldsaye Storm takes on South Bendigo at Triple M Park.

The Jeff Andrews-coached Strathfieldsaye faces an opponent which dominated last Saturday's stand-alone game at Broadford.

Huge plus for Storm is the return of key forward James Schischka and on-baller Daniel Clohesy from injury.

Strathfieldsaye was beaten by the Bloods in last season's elimination final.

Both line-ups have changed markedly.

Storm's recruits include Zane Keighran, Drew Lloyd and Tyson McKenzie.

Players to watch at Strathfieldsaye include Jed Brereton, Zach Charles, Cooper Jones, Ben Lester, George Simpson and Riley Wilson.

The Bloods from South Bendigo can expect a higher level of pressure this round.

There was plenty to like about the play of gun recruit Coen Harker in the big win on Broadford's turf.

Key targets in attack include Mac Cameron, Brock Harvey and Alex Smith.

An on-ball group of Callum Crisp, Coen Harker and Brody Haddow is capable of winning many clearances and setting up scoring chances.

Castlemaine's Bailey Henderson marks his senior coaching debut as the Magpies are in their Camp Reserve nest to take on Golden Square.

The Magpies will be determined to build on the momentum gained in the past two years under coach Michael Hartley who stays on as a player.

Recruits include key forwards Jacob Bauer and Zack Derksen, ruckman Jaise Coleman, and midfielder Dylan Landt.

Injuries struck Castlemaine heavily last season.

A fully-fit Xavier Murley and Riley Pedretti make a huge difference to the line-up.

Many talented youngsters will be determined to have a greater impact in every match.

It's a similar theme at Golden Square which made a strong finish to last season to finish sixth.

Now in his third season as senior coach, Brad Eaton has brought in the experienced Liam Barrett as playing assistant coach.

Newcomers for the Bulldogs include Lee Dale, Isaac Corvo and ruckman Liam Hoy.

Big test for a new-look defence which will have Harry Burke, Noah Warfe and newcomer Archie Edwards play big roles.

The Bulldogs also have one of the league's most versatile key position players in Jayden Burke who predominantly played in defence last season, but could be in attack.

Gisborne will be on home turf at Gardiner Reserve to tackle Kangaroo Flat.

The Rob Waters-coached Gisborne has plenty of experience and skill as Pat McKenna, Brad Bernacki, Braidon Blake, Shane Clough, Matt Merrett, Zach Vescovi, Jed and Zac Denahy, Dylan Johnstone and Harry Luxmoore are in the squad.

Massive challenge for the Tyrone Downie-coached Kangaroo Flat in game one.

The Roos have welcomed back Max Johnson, Mitch Rovers, Jordan Rouse and Mitch Collins to Dower Park.

Newcomers include midfielder/half-back Flynn Clark, and Zac Featherby in defence.

Captain and on-baller Ethan Roberts and ruckman Angus Macpherson will distribute the footy to the likes of Aaron Nevins, Kyle Symons and other hard-running team-mates.

Broadford has the bye.

The long wait is over – footy’s back!

The Bendigo Umpires Association are just as excited about being involved in another action-packed football season as anyone else. We do what we do because we love the game, and look forward to playing our part in assisting players and clubs to enjoy the 2026 season.

We anticipate that everyone will quickly adapt to the slight rule changes and interpretations, and we will be looking to educate players and coaches as best we can around these.

The BUA is committed to strengthening its numbers and welcomes new members from across local communities for field, boundary, and goal umpiring roles. The BUA manages all match appointments throughout the season across 6 leagues and is seeking support from those willing to umpire in 2026. These positions are paid, and the association offers flexibility in scheduling based on individual locations. Umpiring offers a great part-time opportunity, with boundary umpiring available from as young as 12 years old. Payments for umpiring are tax-free, as it is considered a hobby.

We also provide extensive support and training. Understanding that officiating demands specialised skills, the BUA offers structured training delivered by experienced umpires. The training covers rule interpretation, game management, positioning, and decision-making



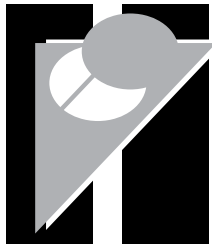
under pressure. Additionally, ongoing mentorship and feedback are available to foster continued growth and development among umpires.

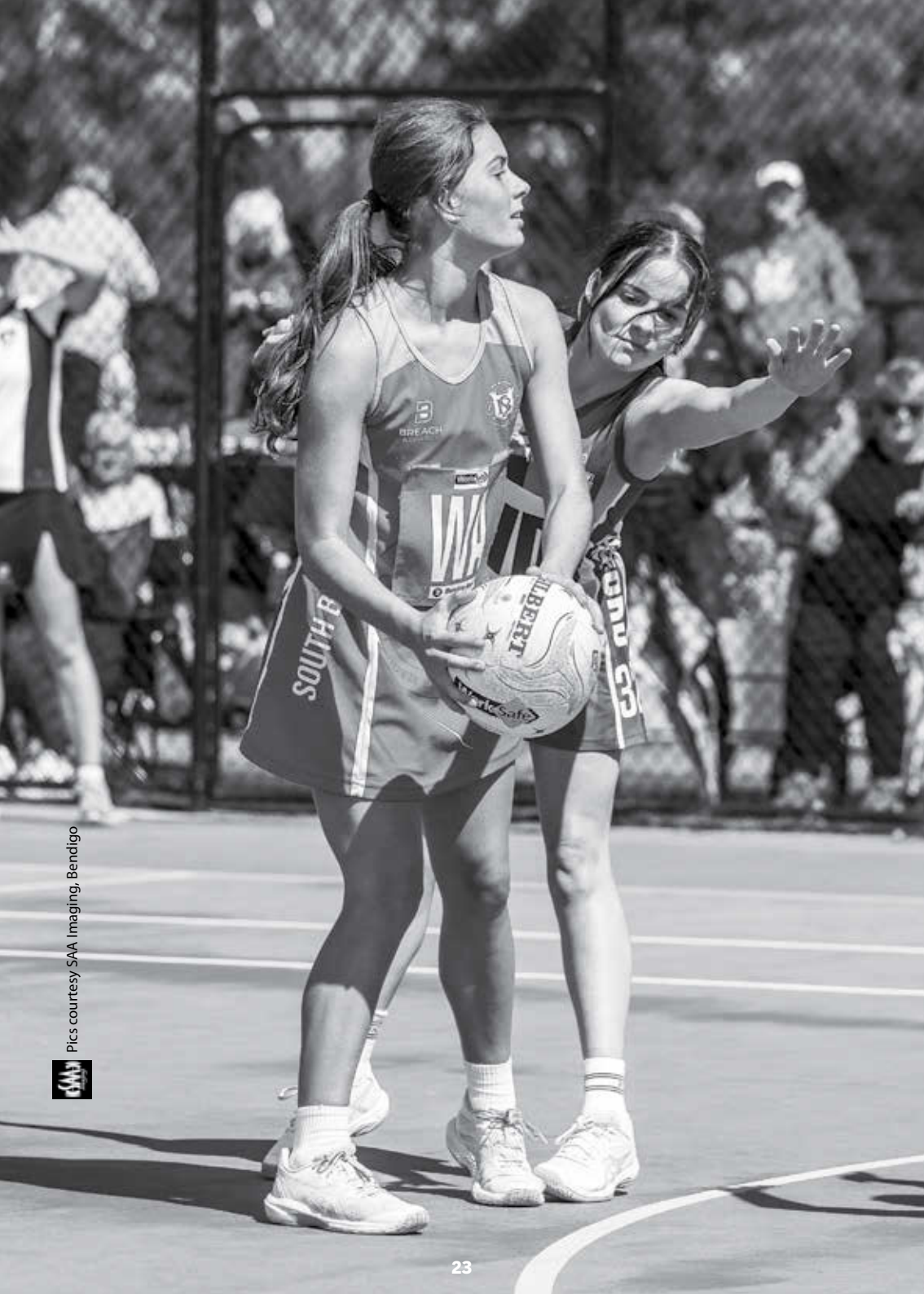

QEO co-tenants ready to christen new turf, 2011

Sandhurst and South Bendigo were scheduled to christen the new-look Queen Elizabeth Oval in the opening rounds of the 2011 season.

But it wasn't pencilled in during early December 15 years back as a Round 1 fixture for the 2011 season.

No, the Dragons and Bloods were scheduled to play for the Graeme Wright Memorial Trophy in Rd. 6 --- Saturday, 14th May.

In late 2010 the QEO was coming to the completion of a major overhaul which included the laying of a long-awaited new surface.

Plus the ground's playing size had been reduced from an almost rectangular shape (a dimension often favourably remarked on by visiting inter-league players) to a more recognisable oval dimension.

The BFL had scheduled no games at the Q for the first five rounds of 2011.

"We think that the Rd. 6 decision is a pretty good time to christen the QEO and it's an appropriate game to schedule first-up for the new QEO," BFNL CEO Steven Oliver said.

"We've been told that the ground has to set for eight weeks after the works are completed, so if the time-frame is stuck to then it would have had 11 weeks to settle before that Sandhurst-South Bendigo game," he said.

"So we're not going to try and push things along for some short-term gain if it's going to mean some long-term damage, if the surface hasn't settled properly."

So with the QEO off-limits early in the season the Dragons and Bloods required alternative venues for their first two home games in that 2011 season.

Sandhurst's alternative home ground was to be Huntly's Strauch Reserve and the draw had the Dragons hosting Golden Square there in Rd. 2 in 2011 and Kangaroo Flat in Rd. 4.

As one of our preferred ovals for our daily family walks I remember seeing the Sexton brothers and their families picking up rubbish behind the Huntly oval goals on the Sundays after those fixtures.

Kennington's Harry Trott oval ---- these days the home of the Bloods and formerly the home ground of the defunct Kennington-Strathdale F.C. --- had been earmarked for South to host Eaglehawk in Rd. 2 and Maryborough in Rd. 4.

The opening round 14 seasons back started with reigning flag-holders Square matched up against South in a re-boot of the 2010 grannie. It was the only afternoon game listed for Rd. 1 with three other clashes set for Saturday night.

The Sunday fixture had Eaglehawk pitted against Maryborough at Canterbury Park.

That draw had Sunday matches listed for the opening four rounds and again on the then Queen's Birthday weekend in June. Then with Rd. 12 in early July with two Sunday matches set down (Storm vs. Square and South vs. Flat) plus another in mid-August, Rd. 16, and the second last fixture on Sunday, August 21st: Hurst vs. Storm.

Of course the first two rounds of finals were played on Sundays, just as they are today,

Meanwhile on the recruiting front Eaglehawk premiership player Brodie Filo was returning to the BFNL for the 2011 season.

But it wasn't to be at the Hawks where he'd been a key member of the Two Blues 2007 flag-winning side, or at Kyneton where Dad Derrick was the senior coach.

Instead Brodie had signed up with the Filo family's heart-and-soul club Castlemaine, following his stint with Peel Thunder in the West Australian Football League.

"We're really excited to have Brodie back on board," Magpies coach Paul Eyles said.

"He has been fantastic at training and wants to play for Castlemaine which, of course, is his home town.

"He could have gone anywhere so we're rapt he has chosen the Maine," said Eyles.

Filo played 19 games for the W.A. Thunder in the 2010 season kicking 31 goals and averaging 18.2 disposals per game.

Fifteen years back Brodie Filo was just 20-years-old with his attributes including blistering pace, a booming kick coupled with smart goal sense.

His talent was on display for the BFNL in the 2009 inter-league win over Ballarat at Bacchus Marsh where he was among the Blue and Gold's best in the upset 21-point victory.

[Note: BFNL CEO Steven Oliver, then 38, pulled on the boots for Bendigo and kicked a couple of goals. He was in the side because of a shortage of committed senior BFNL players.]

Apart from Filo, Eyles and his colleagues had also signed ruckman Carlin Gyorffy, who was training with the North Ballarat Roosters that December 15 years back, plus mid Nick Bone who had previously spent three years with the Roosters.

Bone had spent 2008-2009 playing with Learmonth in the Central Highlands Football and Netball League.

And those signings came on top of Castlemaine's acquisitions of former VFL-listed on-baller Wayne Schultz and key position player Harmit Singh earlier in the 2010-2011 pre-season.

Plus mids Lachlan Brown, just 11 games short of his 200-game career with the Maine, and Adam Culvenor were returning to the Camp Reserve for the 2011 season.

But off Eyles' list were two important players: prime forward Daniel Christmas, who'd been the Magpies' top goalkicker in three of their past four seasons, plus key position player Adrian Conn who'd signed with Newstead in the MCDLF.

So, onwards towards September. Actually the 2011 grannie turned out to be a non-event.

Golden Square bolted home to the third of their five consecutive premierships with a 135-point thumping of Eaglehawk: 25.18 (168) to the Borough's miserable 5.3 (33).

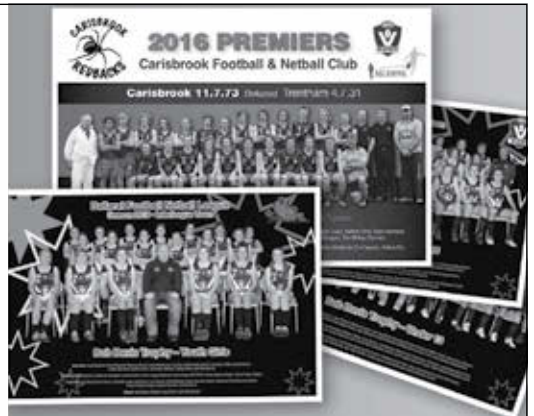
