

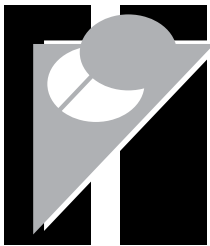

Round Preview



A hat-trick of defeats is a prospect Sandhurst's senior footy teams have not faced in many Bendigo Bank Bendigo FNL seasons.

The Dragons confront that scenario in the King's Birthday holiday weekend match on Gisborne's turf at Gardiner Reserve.

Heat's on the Dragons after they were beaten by South Bendigo in the Graeme Wright Memorial Cup match, and then in last Sunday's clash with Strathfieldsaye to complete Indigenous Round.

Fighting to regain confidence and form, Sandhurst faces arguably the most daunting road trip in the competition.

A Gisborne line-up packed with on-ball stars Braidon Blake, Brad Bernacki, James Gray and Dylan Johnstone awaits for another big challenge.

Gun forward Pat McKenna kicked 14 goals in the win at Broadford and looms as a huge threat to Sandhurst's chances of claiming the four points.

The Bulldogs had plenty of players slot goals at Broadford.

Multiple goalkickers in the big win were Campbell Johns, Zac Denahy, Lucas Hannon, Dominic Sullivan, Thomas Werner, and Kobe Zerafa.

Bulldogs' captain Zach Vescovi is having an outstanding season in defence.

For a Sandhurst team coached by Bryce Curnow, non-playing, and Fergus Greene, playing, it will be pressure and workrate that play a major part in their game.

Key players in the maroon and blue include Tom Campbell, James Coghlan, Caleb Connick, Lachie Hood, Cobi Maxted, Darcy Mills, Nick Stagg and Lachlan Wright.

Strathfieldsaye tackles Golden Square in Storm territory at Triple M Park in Tannery Lane.

The Jeff Andrews-coached Strathfieldsaye has moved to the third rung and will fight to hold a double chance at finals time.

Since a 35-point loss at Gisborne in round three Storm has struck back to beat Castlemaine, Eaglehawk, Broadford and Sandhurst.

Highs for Strathfieldsaye include the form of key forward James Schischka who kicked six goals in

the latest victory on Sandhurst's turf.

There's plenty of running power and skill in a Storm line-up that includes Daniel Clohesy, Jaidi Jackson-Leahy, Pat Blake, Hunter Lawrence, and Darcy and Riley Mulquiny.

Another big test for Golden Square following its home game against South Bendigo.

Key players in a Bulldogs' line-up coached by Brad Eaton, non-playing, and Liam Barrett, playing, include Jordan Rosengren, Harry and Jayden Burke, Tom Strauch, Jack McMahon and Jack Stewart.

Carson James will be keen to perform well against his former club.

Castlemaine takes on Broadford at The Railway Hotel in Castlemaine's Camp Reserve.

The Bailey Henderson-coached Magpies had a tough run in May as they played Strathfieldsaye, Gisborne, and reigning premier Eaglehawk.

The Magpies start hot favourite to take the points against the Kangaroos.

Key players for Castlemaine include Michael Hartley, Dylan Landt, Zavier Murley, Darby Semmens, and John Watson.

Broadford faced a red-hot Gisborne on the Kangaroos' ground at Harley Hammond Reserve last Saturday.

Every match is a learning experience for a young Broadford team coached by Nathan Thompson.

Key players for the Kangaroos include Jay Eager, Seb Morris, Adam Miles, Ben and Louis Thompson, and Taiten Thomas.

The ladder-leading South Bendigo is back on its turf at Harry Trott Oval in Kennington to play Kangaroo Flat.

Competition for places in the Bloods' best is hot.

As such co-coaches Troy Coates, non-playing, and Jack Fallon, playing, will be keen to see the team sustain its high level of intensity and skill.

In-form players for South Bendigo include Tom Templeton in the centre, on-ballers Brody Haddow and Coen Harker, and Will Allen at centre half-back.

Highlight of this contest will be in the ruck where

the Bloods have Callum Crisp and Mac Cameron to take on Kangaroo Flat gun Angus Macpherson.

One of the Roos' most consistent players, Macpherson played a big role as Bendigo defeated Ovens and Murray in the inter-league match.

Another big test for the Tyrone Downie-coached Kangaroo Flat.

The Roos' play at centre ball-ups and stoppages will be crucial in limiting the Bloods having an easy run into attack.

A strong forward line for South Bendigo includes Brock Harvey, Logan Howell, Alex Smith and Anthony Zimmerman.

Kangaroo Flat had the bye last round following a 39-point loss to Golden Square.

Players to watch for the Roos include Nick Keogh in attack, Aaron Nevins, Mitch Collins, Max Johnson and Mitch Rovers.

Eaglehawk has the bye.

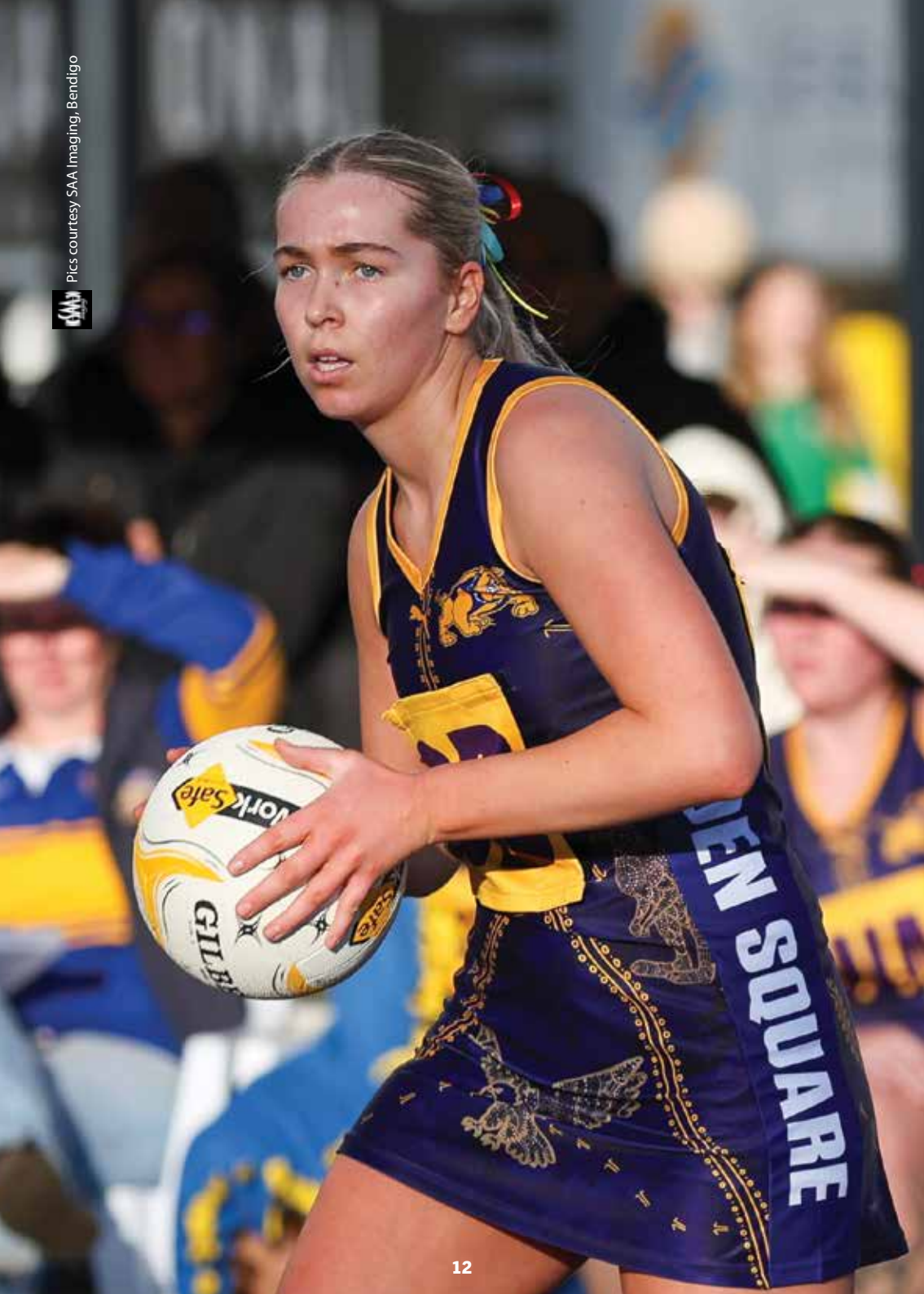

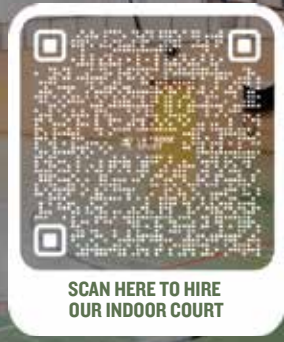

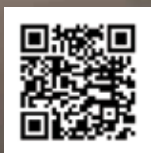

Reflections...

Bloods rule league in early to mid-Nineties

South Bendigo enjoyed a great early to mid-1990s period playing off in five BFNL grand finals and taking home the premiership Bendigo Addy Cup no less than four times.

Playing coach Peter Curran was the central figure in the Bloods' period of ascendancy, assisted by great South players such as Peter 'Tiger' Tyack, Simon McLean (both Michelsen Medallists), key position star Stephen McMurray, tough and pacy on-ballers Robin Keck and Ross Maxted capped off by key forwards Phil Hetherington and David Nicholas.

Keck has maintained his strong connection with the Bloods and his son Will has been a key player with South for quite a number of seasons.

I served with 'Tiger' Tyack on a couple of Hall of Fame selection panels, under chairman Peter Davey, and his knowledge of footy personalities is unmatched.

Tiger could tell fellow panellists where it was best for him to move to, on South's forward line, when opposition backs were crowding in.

And he knew plenty about Hall of Fame candidates when names came up for discussion.

For instance in the 2019 discussion, Tiger knew where Maine's John Jefferies and Hurst's Matt Sexton, plus South's Graeme Wright, would be moved to in defence when their clubs were under pressure

They could occupy key defence positions and thwart opposition sides from going straight up the ground..

The Tigers weren't short of quality players, either with Tony Kelly, Simon Elsum, Nick Heath and Roger Cordy --- among a great group ---- some of the standouts.

But just like every other side three decades ago, Kyneton found it extra difficult to keep up the pressure for the full four terms while the Bloods slipped away on the scoreboard.

I've run into 'Kel' (Tony Kelly) in various locations. From a couple of boozers in Kyneton to the MCG when the mighty Cats were playing and he was engaged in his work assignments.

As a former Collingwood senior player I don't recall 'Kel' being too complimentary about my Catters and the last time I saw him there at the G he didn't seem too happy with how Geelong was running away with the four, premiership points.

Back to the game and South had the four points in the bag at the last change with a six-goal lead.

The last term was just played out, as a formality I recall, with just three majors scored.

All that plus Bendigo juniors scores from the under-16s down to the two under-12 grades. Virtually one full page of scores ---- second from the back ---- and just above the weather map and details on that inside page.

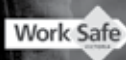
